

REPRESENTATIVE MEMBER

Is chosen from a key stakeholder group, such as staff, students (of high schools and colleges) and parents and citizens to ensure a balanced and effective board.

Board role	Responsibilities
Compliance and administration	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Be a board member > Represent stakeholder group interests and views, but not be that group's advocate > Support the board to act in the best interests of the school and all students
Membership	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Meet board eligibility requirements that: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a school staff member currently works at the school as teaching or other staff (including casual staff) • a school student currently attends the school or is doing a school education program at least 12 hours a week • a parent or carer is a Parents and Citizens' (P&C) Association member, as defined in the P&C's constitution. Membership is usually automatic for parents and carers of students at the school (including any who teach there). An adult who is not a student's parent or carer must first become a school P&C member.

Board reporting	Responsibilities
General documents	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Consult with and report back to the stakeholder group while meeting the board's confidentiality and privacy requirements
