Government School Bulletin

February 2001 Census

## Overview

On 21 February 2001 the ACT Government Schools Census was conducted. The Census indicated that a total of 38,192 students attended $95^{1}$ schools. This represents a decrease of 640 students, or $1.6 \%$, since February 2000.

## Government Schools

A total of 21,194 students attended $69^{1}$ ACT government primary schools. This represents a decrease of 81 students, or $0.4 \%$, since February 2000.

A total of 10,327 students attended $17^{1}$ government high schools. This represents a decrease of 138 students, or $1.3 \%$, since February 2000.

A total of 6,387 students attended 8 government secondary colleges. This represents a decrease of 403 students, or 5.9 \%, since February 2000.

A total of 284 students attended 4 government special schools. This represents a decrease of 18 students, or $1.6 \%$, since February 2000.

## Explanatory Notes

## 1. Reference Date

The census was conducted on Wednesday 21 February 2001.
2. Scope and Coverage

The census includes all ACT government schools providing primary, secondary and special education.
3. Collection

ACT government schools census data was electronically downloaded.

## 4. Student Enrolments

The census includes students enrolled in a government school on census day.

## 5. Special Schools

Special schools cater for students with intellectual and physical disabilities, or who are emotionally and/or behaviourally disturbed.

## 6. Special Classes

Introductory English Centres (IEC)
IECs are for students who require intensive full time English language instruction.

## Hearing Impaired Units (HIU)

HIUs are for students with a significant hearing impairment who require substantial additional support.

## Learning Support Centre (LSC)

LSCs are for students in primary and high schools who are identified as having serious difficulties in achieving expected educational outcomes.

## Learning Support Unit (LSU)

LSUs are for primary aged students who are assessed as needing special support. These classes are located in mainstream primary schools and provide for increased levels of integration and appropriate academic programs.

## Communication Disorder Classes (CDC)

CDCs are for primary aged students who are assessed as needing special support. The units are located in mainstream primary schools and provide for increased levels of integration and appropriate academic programs.

## In February 2001:

Total primary school enrolments were 21,194. This includes 1,400 primary school students enrolled at combined primary/high schools. (In February 2000, the figures were 21,275 (including Jervis Bay) and 1,331 respectively.)

Total high school enrolments were 10,327. This includes 1,648 high school students enrolled at combined
primary/high schools. (In February 2000, the figures were 10,465 and 1,591 respectively.)
The three combined schools are Telopea Park school, Gold Creek school and the Wanniassa
K-10 school.
