

ACT Public School Census August 2010



This publication provides information on students enrolled in ACT schools at 6 August 2010.

Key findings

In August 2010, there were 38 758 students attending the 83 ACT public schools, an increase of 389 students or 1.0 percent from August 2009.

There were 23 005 students (59.4% of all public school students) attending a public primary school, up 295 students or 1.3 percent since August 2009.

Within the primary school sector the number of students at the preschool level has increased by 226 students or 5.7 percent since August 2009.

In August 2010, there were 9757 students (25.2% of all public school students) attending a public school at the high school level, an increase of 80 students or 0.8 percent since August 2009.

There were 5632 students (14.5% of all public school students) attending a public college, an increase of 7 students or 0.1 percent from August 2009.

In August 2010, there were 1995 students accessing special education programs. This was an increase of 49 students or 2.5 percent since August 2009.

Introduction

This publication presents the results from the ACT public school census conducted on Friday 6 August 2010. Unlike the February ACT school census, which includes all ACT schools, the August census conducted by the Department covers public school students only.

This publication also presents information on the number of enrolments of students of school age who undertook school equivalent courses through home education or the Canberra Institute of Technology.

Student enrolments 2006 to 2010

In August 2010, there were 38 758 enrolments in ACT public schools, up by 389 enrolments (1.0%) from August 2009 (Table 1). The increase in total public school enrolments continues the trend from 2009 which saw an increase of 344 enrolments (0.9%) from August 2008. This is the second consecutive year there has been an increase in public school enrolments in both the February and August censuses. This contrasts with the previous 10 years of decreasing public school enrolments.

All levels of schooling showed an increase in 2010 from 2009, with primary school enrolments up by 295 (1.3%), high school enrolments up by 80 (0.8%), college enrolments up by seven (0.1%) and special school enrolments up by 7 (2.0%). This is the first year in over five years there has been an increase in public high school enrolments with the February 2010 census also showing an increase of 68 (0.7%) from February 2009.

When measured over the longer term, total enrolments have increased by 30 (0.1%) since August 2006.

In August 2010, almost six in 10 (59.4%) public school enrolments were at the primary school level. This was up 0.9 percentage points from August 2006. High schools accounted for 25.2 percent of enrolments in 2010, down 0.9 percentage points since 2006. College enrolments accounted for 14.5 percent of the total in both 2006 and 2010.

Indigenous enrolments 2006 to 2010

In August 2010, the number of public school enrolments of students identifying as being of Indigenous origin was 1273. This is an increase of 247 (29.1%) since August 2006 and 66 (5.5%) since August 2009 (Table 2).

Students with special needs 2006 to 2010

In August 2010, the number of enrolments of public school students with special needs was 1995 (Table 3). This is an increase of 134 enrolments (7.2%) since August 2006 and an increase of 49 enrolments (2.5%) since August 2009.

Gender 2006 to 2010

Table 4 shows the numbers of males and females across the various levels of schooling from 2006 to 2010. Consistent with previous years, there were slightly more males (51.3% in 2010) than females in ACT public schools. However, at the college level there was a lower proportion of males (47.9%) than females. This differs from the previous five years where male and female enrolments in college were relatively equal.

Non-school education

It is recognised that there are alternative educational pathways for students to undertake school level courses other than by attending an ACT public or non-government school. For students residing in the ACT as at August 2010, 133 were home educated. In addition, a further 321 students, who were of school age, undertook school equivalent courses at the Canberra Institute of Technology.

Explanatory Notes

Reference date

The 2010 August census was conducted on 6 August 2010.

Scope and coverage

The August census includes all ACT public schools providing primary, secondary and special education. Jervis Bay School is included in ACT public primary schools as the ACT Department of Education and Training administers the Jervis Bay School for the Australian Government under a service agreement.

Collection

ACT public school census data was electronically downloaded from the Department's centralised administrative system.

Student enrolments

The census includes students who were officially enrolled in a school on census day and who were active in a primary, secondary or special education program at that school. Students who were absent for more than four continuous school weeks prior to census date were included if the principal received written documentation signed by the guardian indicating that the student was to return to school on or before Monday 16 August 2010.

Connect₁₀

The Connect10 program supports students to develop a personal pathway plan that may include one or more of the following goals: completion of Year 10 Certificate, transition to years 11 and 12, vocational learning, employment and/or re-engagement with high school. Students in the program are an appropriate age for year 9 or 10 and their participation must be approved by a referral panel. The length of placement is long term, designed to engage students in learning and training and transition to future pathways.

Connect10 programs are conducted at Lake Tuggeranong College (Connect10 Southern), Lake Ginninderra College (Connect10 Northern) and Dickson College (Connect10 Central).

Introductory English Centres (IECs)

Introductory English Centres (IECs) are for students who require intensive full time English language instruction.

There are three IECs in the primary sector, conducted at North Ainslie Primary School (Northside Primary IEC), Hughes Primary School (Southside Primary IEC) and Urambi Primary School (Tuggeranong Primary IEC). There is one IEC in the high school sector and the college sector, conducted at Dickson College (Secondary IEC).

Mature students

Students in public schools aged 20 years or over on 31 January in the year of commencement of their college studies are classified as Mature.

Older students

Students in public schools aged 18 years by 31 December in the year prior to the commencement of their college studies, but not aged 20 years or over on 31 January in the year of commencement of their college studies, are classified as Older.

Primary school level of schooling

The primary school level of schooling includes students from preschool to year 6. Preschool level data may include students who are aged three and attending a preschool program.

High school level of schooling

The high school level of schooling includes those students in years 7, 8, 9 and 10.

College level of schooling

The college level of schooling includes those students in years 11 and 12 as well as those students defined as mature and older.

Special schools

Special schools cater for students with a moderate to profound intellectual disability, severe Autism Spectrum Disorder or with multiple disabilities that require intensive levels of support.

Cranleigh School has introduced a mainstream preschool class. Enrolments in this class are included in primary school level of schooling numbers and not included in special school numbers.

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
