5. OTHER PLANNING MATTERS

5.1 Vegetation Management

An APZ is a fuel-reduced area surrounding a building or structure. It is located between the building or structure and the bush fire hazard. An APZ provides:

- a buffer zone between a bush fire hazard and an asset,
- an area of reduced bush fire fuel that allows for suppression of fire,
- an area from which backburning or hazard reduction can be conducted, and
- an area which allows emergency services access and provides a relatively safe area for firefighters to defend property.

An APZ, if designed correctly and maintained regularly, will reduce the risk of:

- direct flame contact on the building,
- damage to the building asset from intense radiant heat, and
- ember attack.

It is recommended that the subject land be managed to the standard of an Inner Protection Area (IPA). An IPA is located in immediate proximity to the asset and provides a defendable space consisting of minimal fuel loads. An IPA shall display characteristics that include, but are not limited to: a tree canopy cover of less than 15% at maturity, a maximum 30% of the IPA may contain shrubs, trees should have lower limbs (up to 2m in height) removed, shrubs are not to have a connection with tree canopy layer, shrubs should not form more than 10% ground cover, maintain 2 – 5m canopy separation of trees and branches are not to overhang buildings. Wooden sheds, combustible material storage areas, stacked flammable building materials, woodpiles, large areas of garden mulch, for example, are not permitted in the IPA.

5.2 Other Environmental Values

NGH understands that vegetation located within part of the Option 1 expansion area, comprises foraging habitat value for the superb parrot. Under the existing BOP, a large proportion of the investigation areas is currently subject to ongoing vegetation management.

WSP were engaged for the purpose of a Preliminary Biodiversity Assessment (WSP, 2021) of Option 2 expansions area. Native amenity planting occurs along the north-eastern boundary of the site; the trees are small, and no hollows were recorded. The remainder of the site generally comprises exotic vegetation. Native dominated grassland was present in the north-western corner of the site; a majority is subject to ongoing management under the current BOP.

6. CONCLUSION

This assessment bushfire planning considerations acknowledges the proposed development as a category of in-fill development, which is subject to Territory Plan to rezone part Block 6, Section 64, Fraser. The proposed expansion areas are currently under investigation and the intention of this document is to consider the application of prescribed bushfire policy and associated guidelines. In addition to informing the Planning Report, which would be prepared for consideration by the planning and land authority, the findings of this report also aim to guide the potential master planning of the site by way of identifying exclusion zones that may apply, which can directly influence the layout of future development footprint. The bushfire considerations outlined above have outlined minimum requirements to achieve conformance with ACT & (NSW) PBP specifications.

For the purpose of master planning the site, future development of the site shall incorporate the following measures into the proposed development.

Asset Protection Zones

- A 40m APZ is required to be provided from the boundary of the proposed expansion area and is provided wholly within the proposed expansion area, except for where a BOP treatment strategy is mapped externally to the proposed investigation area.
- The APZ must be maintained as an Inner Protection Area.

Landscaping

• Future landscaping shall ensure that APZ specifications are not compromised.

Access

 Property access and internal access arrangements shall ensure access to the site is suitable for emergency response vehicles (such as ACTF&R Compressed Air Foam (CAFS) 8000 fire appliances.

Water and Utilities (Electricity and Gas)

- Water hydrants, or a hydrant booster system shall be provided within the proposed development, for areas that are outside an acceptable distance from water hydrants in the public road network.
- Electricity and gas utilities shall be provided by underground means.

Construction Standards

• Construction standards prescribed under AS3959 is recommended to apply to future buildings, due to the proposed school expansion occurring in a mapped BPA.

Emergency Management

 An emergency management and/or evacuation plan should be prepared prior to the development becoming operational. The emergency plan should be prepared in consultation with ESA. A more detailed assessment can be undertaken once a firm expansion area boundary is known, or once concept plans are available in the future, to provide site layout specific commentary and guidance.

Limitations of this document include, but are not limited to uncertainties in the following areas: Fire Danger Index; fuel loads; existing developments; human behaviour; and maintenance.'

Quote from Standards Australia (AS 3959-2018), 'Although this standard is designed to improve the performance of buildings when subjected to bushfire attack in designated bushfire-prone areas there can be no guarantee that a building will survive a bushfire event on every occasion. This is substantially due to the unpredictable nature and behavior of fire and extreme weather conditions.

A planning report is prepared to provide the information necessary to inform consideration by the planning and land authority, within the Environment, Planning and Sustainable Development Directorate, on preparing a Territory Plan variation in support of the proposal (refer to Part 5.6 of the *Planning and Development Act 2007*).

The planning report is to respond to each of the following parts:

- A. <u>Executive summary</u>
- B. <u>Description of the proposed Territory Plan variation</u>

(A comprehensive description of the site and the proposal, current planning policy, the intended development and use, and all proposed changes to the Territory Plan.)

Provide information on all proposed changes to the Territory Plan and specify any land use changes

Provide information on all proposed changes to the National Capital Plan if any.

C. Justification for the planning policy changes

(An assessment of the opportunity cost of the proposed change, and discussion of changes in the economic, social, natural and physical environment that necessitate the change in both local and broader contexts).

D. Strategic planning policy context

(A discussion of proposed planning policy change and proposed use/development in the context of the ACT's planning framework and strategic planning policy. Identification of any associated changes, e.g. an amendment to the National Capital Plan or public land register).

Relevant ACT Government policies should be considered in the planning report. This includes but not be limited to:

 An environmental assessment in accordance with Environment Protection Authority (EPA) endorsed guidelines to assess it suitability for its proposed use from a contamination perspective.

• Traffic impacts

- A Traffic Impact Assessment (TIA) Report to understand the likely increase in traffic movements and how these will be managed within the site and any impact on the surrounding road network. Details needed are SIDRA intersection analysis for two intersections of Kerrigan street/Shakespeare Cr and Kerrigan/Tillyard Drive
- Consideration for the future of a bus layover and potentially a parking area e.g. for an oval on weekends as well as a Park and Ride nearby.
- Consideration if the road reserve of Shakespeare crescent is sufficient to support the rezoning.
- Traffic impacts on the external road network for an expanded school and increase in proposed number of students should also be examined.

• Impact on active travel and existing cycleways

- Consideration of direct connections to shops and community route linking to the broader network
- Opportunities and constraints for increased active travel in the local area traffic management should also be investigated as part of the rezoning request.

• Bushfire protection requirements:

- A Bushfire Threat Assessment and Compliance Report of the proposal by an accredited Bushfire Consultant is required to demonstrate an appropriate level of protection relative to the hazard is provided.
- The internal and perimeter roads of the development must be designed to allow access for ACTF&R Compressed Air Foam System (CAFS) 8000 fire appliances.

• Utility services

- Consultation with Icon Water to determine the adequacy of existing infrastructure, including hydrant spacing, for the proposed expansion of the school site.
- Consideration that the existing electricity network supply may not be able to cope with the proposed additional demands and hence, the proponent must allow for the space for new pad mount substation within the amended block boundary. The substation siting must comply with Evoenergy substation siting guide and other relevant separation and clearance and earthing requirements.

Additional detailed planning and design considerations, which form part of this scope are listed in <u>Table 1</u>. The proponent must address all comments in accordance with the actions required in the following table.

The Education Directorate proposes to expand the school site to provide for more outdoor area for student learning and play.

The Directorate is facilitating community engagement to provide information on this proposed boundary expansion and seek feedback from the local community as part of preparing a *Variation to the Territory Plan*.

Expansion is being proposed to the northeast of the existing school over land close to Tillyard Drive.

What is proposed? (accordion)

An area of land to the northeast of the school is proposed to be rezoned from open space to community facility land to increase the existing school site by about 1.4 hectares providing additional outdoor space for student learning and play.

No new infrastructure, facilities or changes to the school enrolment capacity are planned.



Why is this proposed? (accordion)

Fraser Primary School is a thriving ACT public school supporting the community of northwest Belconnen. The school has seen enrolment growth over the past years and currently has almost 600 students enrolled from preschool to year 6. The Priority Enrolment Area (PEA) includes Fraser and parts of Charnwood, Dunlop and Flynn.

To accommodate student growth, school facilities have been expanded over a number of years with the installation of Modular Learning Centres (transportable classrooms). These classrooms have been installed on outdoor space within the school grounds and reduced the outdoor play area.

The oval to the south of the school has been used for extra play space but involves students accessing it by crossing a public footpath. This area requires additional teacher supervision when it is used to ensure student safety.

What is the current use of the land proposed for rezoning? (accordion)

This land surrounding the school is currently managed by Transport Canberra and City Services (TCCS) and under the Territory Plan is zoned as *NUZ3: Hills, ridges and buffer areas.* This open space runs alongside the school site and primarily contains cleared pasture and patches of native grasses.

A biodiversity assessment has identified that this part of the block contains 'exotic dominated grassland'. A section of this block further north of the Fraser suburban area (about 500 metres away) is a declared nature reserve for the natural values contained in that area.

A small additional area of land along the northwest edge of the block is included in this proposed Variation that will allow the block boundary of the school to be changed so that it aligns with the existing fence.

The area to the northwest of the school, between the school and Shakespeare Crescent contains scattered native tree plantings and is not proposed to be impacted. This area contains important habitat for native birds including sightings of Superb Parrot (Polytelis swainsonii), which is a declared vulnerable species in the ACT.

What would be the result of the proposed changes to the Territory Plan? (accordion)

The Territory Plan is a statutory document that guides planning and development in the ACT. It is administered by the Environment, Planning and Sustainable Development Directorate and available at https://www.planning.act.gov.au/planning-our-city/territory-plan

A Variation to the Territory Plan is being proposed that would formally:

- Rezone a portion of Block 6, Section 64, Fraser from NUZ3: Hills, ridges and buffer areas to CFZ: Community Facilities Zone
- Amend the Fraser Precinct Code Fraser Precinct Map by extending the PD1 map area to include the subject land. No changes to the prohibited uses listed at Table 1 are proposed.

If approved, custodianship of the land affected by the Variation would also be transferred from TCCS to the Education Directorate and incorporated into the Fraser Primary School site.



How has the Education Directorate approached this? (accordion)

The provision of land for community facilities including schools within the ACT is a strategic priority for the ACT Government. The Education Directorate identifies this in the *Future of Education Strategy* (2018) and *Strategic Plan 2018-2021* available at https://www.education.act.gov.au/our-

priorities/future-of-education. These documents outline the Government's education strategy for 2018 to 2028 and the Directorate's strategic framework in key areas.

The Strategy establishes a policy direction that informs a range of future initiatives and projects. The Strategy has a principle of access: "Supports for learning and wellbeing are available and provided to all students." The Plan includes a number of strategic goals, including ensuring schools are where students enjoy and thrive in learning.

Adequate school capacity and facilities in our communities are critical to ensuring all children have reasonable access to learning as the population grows. The area identified under this proposal for an expansion of the land available for students at Fraser Primary School will support the Government's and Directorate's strategic objectives.

What is the long term plans for the additional land? (accordion)

No new buildings or facilities are proposed as part of this rezoning process and this proposal is for a permanent expansion of the land area only.

If new school infrastructure is needed in future, the Directorate would working closely with the school and the community through a separate process to consider the full range of matters such as design, masterplanning, active travel, car parking and traffic management.

The Priority Enrolment Area (PEA) includes Fraser and parts of Charnwood, Dunlop and Flynn.

To accommodate student growth, s<u>S</u>chool facilities have been expanded over a number of years with the installation of <u>Modular Learning Centres (</u>transportable classrooms to accommodate <u>student growth</u>). These classrooms have been installed on outdoor space within the school grounds and reduced the outdoor play area.

The oval to the south of the school has been used for extra play space but involves students accessing it by crossing a public footpath. This area requires additional teacher supervision when it is used to ensure student safety.

What is the current use of the land proposed for rezoning?

This land surrounding the school is currently managed by Transport Canberra and City Services (TCCS) and under the Territory Plan is zoned as *NUZ3: Hills, ridges and buffer areas*. This open space runs alongside the school site and primarily contains cleared pasture and patches of native grasses.

A biodiversity assessment has identified that this part of the block contains 'exotic dominated grassland'. A section of this block further north of the Fraser suburban area (about 500 metres away) is a declared nature reserve for the natural values contained in that area.

A small additional area of land along the northwest edge of the block is included in this proposed Variation that will allow the block boundary of the school to be changed so that it aligns with the existing fence.

The area to the northwest of the school, between the school and Shakespeare Crescent contains scattered native tree plantings and is not proposed to be impacted. This area contains important habitat for native birds including sightings of Superb Parrot (Polytelis swainsonii), which is a declared vulnerable species in the ACT.

What would be the result of the proposed changes to the Territory Plan?

The Territory Plan is a statutory document that guides planning and development in the ACT. It is administered by the Environment, Planning and Sustainable Development Directorate and available at https://www.planning.act.gov.au/planning-our-city/territory-plan

A vertaition to the Territory Plan is being proposed that would formally:

- Rezone a portion of Block 6, Section 64, Fraser from NUZ3: Hills, ridges and buffer areas to CFZ: Community Facilities Zone
- Amend the Fraser Precinct Code Fraser Precinct Map by extending the PD1 map area to include the subject land. No changes to the prohibited uses listed at Table 1 are proposed.

If approved, custodianship of the land affected by the <u>v</u>-variation would also be transferred from TCCS to the Education Directorate and incorporated into the Fraser Primary School site.



How has the Education Directorate approached this?

The provision of land for community facilities including schools within the ACT is a strategic priority for the ACT Government. The Education Directorate identifies this in the *Future of Education Strategy* (2018) and *Strategic Plan 2018-2021* available at https://www.education.act.gov.au/our-priorities/future-of-education. Traffic Distribution (see TIA Guide, Section 4.3)

The Proposed expansion will not create additional traffic generation since there will not be any increase in the number of students. However, given the expansion of school area, following improvements needs to be considered.

BUS STOP REQUIREMENTS

Section 5.4 of the ACT's Traffic Management and Safety Guide specifies that, wherever possible, bus stops should be located away from crossings and with good visibility. Crossings to and from the bus stop should also have good visibility. Vehicles should not stop within 20m of the rear and 10m of the front of the bus. Bus zone signs should be used in the case of multiple buses. Bus stops should also avoid preventing other vehicles from circulating, especially when stationed for longer timeframes.

The existing parking lot layout and bus stop infrastructure meets these requirements.

ACTIVE TRAVEL ASSESSMENT

Whilst the existing network provides walking and cycling linkages to the existing school boundary, given that the future expansion area which is far from the existing underpass crossing in south of the existing school, the following improvement works are recommended as part of the proposed development to continue to support walking and cycling modes of travel:

- A new Children's Crossing in Tillyard Drive adjacent the school frontage be investigated.
- Upgrade the footpath in open space area to provide a 3m shared path for mixed pedestrian and bicycle usage.
- Construct a 3m shared path along Tillyard Drive in both sides from Daley Crescent South to Daley Crescent North intersection to provide shared path for mixed pedestrian and bicycle usage.

Section 5.3.1 of the ACT's Traffic Management and Safety Guide indicates that the Children's crossings are appropriate when the minimum number of students crossing per peak half hour is 20 and the minimum number of vehicles passing in the same half hour is 50. Crossing movements should be contained within a 30m section of road.

Proposed Boundary Expansion for Fraser Primary School

The Education Directorate is proposing to expand the Fraser Primary School site boundary to provide more outdoor space for student learning and play.

We are seeking feedback from the local community as part of this process which requires variation to the <u>Territory Plan</u>.

The proposed expansion is to the north-east of the existing school to include additional land close to Tillyard Drive.

What is proposed?

An area of land to the northeast of the school is proposed to be re-zoned from open space to community facility land to increase the existing school site by about 1.4 hectares providing additional outdoor space for student learning and play. The proposed new school area is shown on the map below.

No new infrastructure, facilities or changes to the school enrolment capacity are planned. The Government will continue to monitor public education needs in the Belconnen region as our city grows.



Why is this proposed?

Fraser Primary School is a thriving ACT public school supporting the community of northwest Belconnen. The school has seen enrolment grow in recent years and now has almost 600 students enrolled from Preschool to Year 6. The school's Priority Enrolment Area (PEA) includes Fraser and parts of Charnwood, Dunlop and Flynn.

School facilities have been expanded over a number of years with the installation of transportable classrooms to accommodate student growth. These classrooms have been installed on outdoor space within the school grounds and reduced the outdoor play area.

The oval to the south of the school has been used for extra play space but involves students accessing it by crossing a public footpath and additional teacher supervision will be in place when this area is used to ensure student safety.

What is the current use of the land proposed for rezoning?

This land surrounding the school is currently managed by the ACT Government through Transport Canberra and City Services (TCCS) and under the Territory Plan is zoned as *NUZ3: Hills, ridges and buffer areas*. This open space runs alongside the school site and primarily contains cleared pasture and patches of native grasses.

A biodiversity assessment has identified that this part of the block contains 'exotic dominated grassland'. A section of this block further north of the Fraser suburban area (about 500 metres away) is a declared nature reserve for the natural values contained in that area.

A small additional area of land along the northwest edge of the block is included in this proposed Variation that will allow the block boundary of the school to be changed so that it aligns with the existing fence.

The area to the northwest of the school, between the school and Shakespeare Crescent contains scattered native tree plantings and is not proposed to be impacted. This area contains important habitat for native birds including sightings of Superb Parrot, which is a declared vulnerable species in the ACT.


What would be the result of the proposed changes to the Territory Plan?

The Territory Plan is a statutory document that guides planning and development in the ACT. It is administered by the Environment, Planning and Sustainable Development Directorate and available at https://www.planning.act.gov.au/planning-our-city/territory-plan

A variation to the Territory Plan is being proposed that would formally:

- Rezone a portion of Block 6, Section 64, Fraser from NUZ3: Hills, Ridges and Buffer Zone to CFZ: Community Facility Zone
- Amend the Fraser Precinct Code Fraser Precinct Map by extending the PD1 map area to include the subject land. No changes to the prohibited uses listed at Table 1 are proposed.

If approved, custodianship of the land affected by the variation would also be transferred from TCCS to the Education Directorate and incorporated into the Fraser Primary School site.



How has the Education Directorate approached this?

The provision of land for community facilities including schools within the ACT is a strategic priority for the ACT Government. The Education Directorate identifies this in the *Future of Education*

Strategy (2018) and *Strategic Plan 2018-2021* available at https://www.education.act.gov.au/our-priorities/future-of-education. These documents outline the Government's education strategy for 2018 to 2028 and the Directorate's strategic framework in key areas.

The Strategy establishes a policy direction that informs a range of future initiatives and projects. The Strategy has a principle of access: "Supports for learning and wellbeing are available and provided to all students." The Plan includes a number of strategic goals, including ensuring schools are where students enjoy and thrive in learning.

The area identified under this proposal for an expansion of the land available for students at Fraser Primary School will support the Government's and Directorate's strategic objectives, including meeting population and public school enrolment growth through providing ACT public education facilities and access to open space and play areas.

What are the long-term plans for the additional land?

No new buildings or facilities are proposed as part of this rezoning process and this proposal is for a permanent expansion of the land area only.

The Directorate monitors and plans for population and public school enrolment growth for all regions of the ACT, including developing areas such as Belconnen, and will continue to monitor the public education needs of the Fraser Primary school community in the future.



No new infrastructure, facilities or changes to the school enrolment capacity are planned. The Government will continue to monitor public education needs in the Belconnen region as our city grows

Commented [HR1]: I think this needs further explanation. I don't think the site could be used for 'student learning and play' without work to make it suitable/safe. I know we can't get ahead of government decisions, but I think we need to step out the process. Something like (and please feel free to make this better):

"This is a growing community, and a growing school. While there hasn't been a government decision to fund a further expansion onto this land at this stage, we know the school will need more space in the medium term. Doing a territory plan variation is the first step in this process, and if successful will give us the flexibility we need to meet the needs of the school community over the coming years."

Can we also request that we run these comms past the P&C president/secretary. They're quite active and have met with the Minister about this issue. I think they'd give good feedback about whether these comms will make sense to the community, and whether there are any additional questions we can be answering.

Also, the consultation period feels a little short. Does it meet the legislative requirements? Even if it does, what would be the consequences of extending?



Why is this proposed?

Fraser Primary School is a thriving ACT public school supporting the community of northwest Belconnen. The school has seen enrolment grow in recent years and now has almost 600 students enrolled from Preschool to Year 6. The school's Priority Enrolment Area (PEA) includes Fraser and parts of Charnwood, Dunlop and Flynn.

School facilities have been expanded over a number of years with the installation of transportable classrooms to accommodate student growth. These classrooms have been installed on outdoor space within the school grounds and reduced the outdoor play area.

The oval to the south of the school has been used for extra play space but involves students accessing it by crossing a public footpath and additional teacher supervision will be in place when this area is used to ensure student safety.

What is the current use of the land proposed for rezoning?

This land surrounding the school is currently managed by the ACT Government through Transport Canberra and City Services (TCCS) and under the Territory Plan is zoned as *NUZ3: Hills, ridges and buffer areas*. This open space runs alongside the school site and primarily contains cleared pasture and patches of native grasses.

A biodiversity assessment has identified that this part of the block contains 'exotic dominated grassland'. A section of this block further north of the Fraser suburban area (about 500 metres away) is a declared nature reserve for the natural values contained in that area.

A small additional area of land along the northwest edge of the block is included in this proposed variation that will allow the block boundary of the school to be changed so that it aligns with the existing fence.

The area to the northwest of the school, between the school and Shakespeare Crescent contains scattered native tree plantings and is not proposed to be impacted. This area contains important habitat for native birds including sightings of Superb Parrot, which is a declared vulnerable species in the ACT.


What would be the result of the proposed changes to the Territory Plan?

The Territory Plan is a statutory document that guides planning and development in the ACT. It is administered by the Environment, Planning and Sustainable Development Directorate and available at https://www.planning.act.gov.au/planning-our-city/territory-plan

A variation to the Territory Plan is being proposed that would formally:

- Rezone a portion of Block 6, Section 64, Fraser from NUZ3: Hills, Ridges and Buffer Zone to CFZ: Community Facility Zone
- Amend the Fraser Precinct Code Fraser Precinct Map by extending the PD1 map area to include the subject land. No changes to the prohibited uses listed at Table 1 are proposed.

If approved, custodianship of the land affected by the variation would also be transferred from TCCS to the Education Directorate and incorporated into the Fraser Primary School site.



How has the Education Directorate approached this?

The provision of land for community facilities including schools within the ACT is a strategic priority for the ACT Government. The Education Directorate identifies this in the *Future of Education*

Strategy (2018) and *Strategic Plan 2018-2021* available at https://www.education.act.gov.au/our-priorities/future-of-education. These documents outline the Government's education strategy for 2018 to 2028 and the Directorate's strategic framework in key areas.

The Strategy establishes a policy direction that informs a range of future initiatives and projects. The Strategy has a principle of access: "Supports for learning and wellbeing are available and provided to all students." The Plan includes a number of strategic goals, including ensuring schools are where students enjoy and thrive in learning.

The area identified under this proposal for an expansion of the land available for students at Fraser Primary School will support the Government's and Directorate's strategic objectives, including meeting population and public school enrolment growth through providing ACT public education facilities and access to open space and play areas.

What are the long-term plans for the additional land?

No new buildings or facilities are proposed as part of this rezoning process and this proposal is for a permanent expansion of the land area only.

The Directorate monitors and plans for population and public school enrolment growth for all regions of the ACT, including developing areas such as Belconnen, and will continue to monitor the public education needs of the Fraser Primary school community in the future.

Does the consultation timeframe meet the legislative requirements? Even if it does, what would be the consequences of extending?

- Yes. There is no prescribed time period for community engagement at this stage of the planning process under the Planning and Development Act 2007. A 2--4 week period is considered standard practice, in line with the ACT Community Engagement Guideline.
- The Garran Primary School TPV consultation was also open for the same 4 week time period (7 April 2022 6 May 2022).
- We do not recommend extending the consultation period to 6-8 weeks as there would be a range of impacts (including not meeting the expectations of the consultant as set out in the contract). This time period is particularly appropriate as this is considered a low complexity project under the Guidelines.
- We are working to a program which allows for this 4 week engagement period, review and response time, to enable completion of the draft planning package by mid-December 2022.
- EDU have already sought an extension of time from EPSDD to submit our draft planning package supporting the proposed Territory Plan Variation, which also includes the community consultation feedback report (the extension was sought largely due to key EDU personnel being on leave). EPSDD have granted an extension until 16 December 2022. A request for a further extension may not be granted.
- In developing the package for engagement, EDU have worked closely with the school including briefing the Board and P&C. They are supportive of the proposal.
- Following the Directorate's 4 week consultation period, all variations are subject to a mandatory public notification period by EPSDD of at least 30 working days, generally through YourSay.

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

Fraser Primary School Boundary Expansion - Community consultation on a Proposed TPV September-October 2022 Education Directorate

Proposed Boundary Expansion for Fraser Primary School

The Education Directorate is proposing to expand the Fraser Primary School site boundary to provide more outdoor space for student learning and play.

We are seeking feedback from the local community as part of this process which requires variation to the <u>Territory Plan</u>.

The proposed expansion is to the north-east of the existing school to include additional land close to Tillyard Drive.

What is proposed?

An area of land to the northeast of the school is proposed to be re-zoned from open space to community facility land to increase the existing school site by about 1.4 hectares providing additional outdoor space for student learning and play. The proposed new school area is shown on the map below.

This is a growing community, and a growing school. While there hasn't been a Government decision for a permanent expansion of the school at this stage, we know the school will need more space in the medium term. Doing a Territory Plan Variation is the first step in this process, and will give us the flexibility we need to meet the needs of the school community over the coming years. The Government will continue to monitor current and forecast enrolment demand at this school and for the Belconnen region in the future.



Why is this proposed?

Fraser Primary School is a thriving ACT public school supporting the community of northwest Belconnen. The school has seen enrolment grow in recent years and now has almost 600 students enrolled from Preschool to Year 6. The school's Priority Enrolment Area (PEA) includes Fraser and parts of Charnwood, Dunlop and Flynn.

School facilities have been expanded over a number of years with the installation of transportable classrooms to accommodate student growth. These classrooms have been installed on outdoor space within the school grounds and reduced the outdoor play area.

The oval to the south of the school has been used for extra play space but involves students accessing it by crossing a public footpath and additional teacher supervision will be in place when this area is used to ensure student safety.

What is the current use of the land proposed for rezoning?

This land surrounding the school is currently managed by the ACT Government through Transport Canberra and City Services (TCCS) and under the Territory Plan is zoned as *NUZ3: Hills, ridges and buffer areas*. This open space runs alongside the school site and primarily contains cleared pasture and patches of native grasses.

A biodiversity assessment has identified that this part of the block contains 'exotic dominated grassland'. A section of this block further north of the Fraser suburban area (about 500 metres away) is a declared nature reserve for the natural values contained in that area.

A small additional area of land along the northwest edge of the block is included in this proposed variation that will allow the block boundary of the school to be changed so that it aligns with the existing fence.

The area to the northwest of the school, between the school and Shakespeare Crescent contains scattered native tree plantings and is not proposed to be impacted. This area contains important habitat for native birds including sightings of Superb Parrot, which is a declared vulnerable species in the ACT.

What would be the result of the proposed changes to the Territory Plan?


The <u>Territory Plan</u> is a statutory document that guides planning and development in the ACT. It is administered by the Environment, Planning and Sustainable Development Directorate and available at <u>https://www.planning.act.gov.au/planning-our-city/territory-plan</u>

A variation to the Territory Plan is being proposed that would formally:

- Rezone a portion of Block 6, Section 64, Fraser from NUZ3: Hills, Ridges and Buffer Zone to CFZ: Community Facility Zone
- Amend the Fraser Precinct Code Fraser Precinct Map by extending the PD1 map area to include the subject land. No changes to the prohibited uses listed at Table 1 are proposed.

If approved, custodianship of the land affected by the variation would also be transferred from TCCS to the Education Directorate and incorporated into the Fraser Primary School site.

How has the Education Directorate approached this?

The provision of land for community facilities including schools within the ACT is a strategic priority for the ACT Government. The Education Directorate identifies this in the *Future of Education Strategy* (2018) and *Strategic Plan 2018-2021* available at https://www.education.act.gov.au/our-priorities/future-of-education. These documents outline the Government's education strategy for 2018 to 2028 and the Directorate's strategic framework in key areas.

The Strategy establishes a policy direction that informs a range of future initiatives and projects. The Strategy has a principle of access: "Supports for learning and wellbeing are available and provided to all students." The Plan includes a number of strategic goals, including ensuring schools are where students enjoy and thrive in learning.

The area identified under this proposal for an expansion of the land available for students at Fraser Primary School will support the Government's and Directorate's strategic objectives, including meeting population and public school enrolment growth through providing ACT public education facilities and access to open space and play areas.

What are the long-term plans for the additional land?

No new buildings or facilities are proposed as part of this rezoning process and this proposal is for a permanent expansion of the land area only.

The Directorate monitors and plans for population and public school enrolment growth for all regions of the ACT, including developing areas such as Belconnen, and will continue to monitor the public education needs of the Fraser Primary school community in the future.

Dear Planning Officer

I am writing to lodge my objection to the expansion of the Fraser Primary School Boundary line. My reasons are as follows:

1. I am the owner / resident of Tillyard Drive and the current poor traffic congestion resultant from the lack of parking is already adversely impacting my ability to enjoy my neighbourhood. I have difficulty getting in and out of my driveway because cars are already banked up and parked illegally as to drop off/ pick up their children. I have contacted both the school and ACT government to assist in the management of the traffic and neither are able to address this situation. This is simply unacceptable.

Traffic and road management is the responsibility of the ACT government and I am disappointed in the lack of appropriate infrastructure commensurate with a growing population.

2. The current area surrounding the school is currently managed by the ACT Government through Transport Canberra and City Services (TCCS) and under the Territory Plan is zoned as *NUZ3: Hills, ridges and buffer areas*. This open space runs alongside the school site and primarily contains cleared pasture and patches of native grasses.

A biodiversity assessment has identified that this part of the block contains 'exotic dominated grassland'. A section of this block further north of the Fraser suburban area (about 500 metres away) is a declared nature reserve for the natural values contained in that area.

Accordingly I wish for this to be preserved to retain the biodiversity of the environment.

3. The process of consultation should be genuine consultation and co design. I would appreciate that there is transparency in all communications as the first that I found out about the expansion of the Fraser primary school boundary line was through social media and not through a letter despite the ACT Government having my details and could have written directly to me.

4. An environmental impact study and cost benefit analysis should be undertaken prior to any expansion of the school.

5. Please provide the source documentation which supports the expansion of the Fraser primary school as the ageing population does not appear to support the premise.

6. Please provide the number of students who attend Fraser who do not reside within Fraser. Without anticipating the cost benefit analysis associated with the proposed expansion of Fraser primary school please provide me with the necessity arguments for this expansion.



Thank you all for the opportunity to meet and share information about the Fraser Primary School Territory Plan Variation process.

This evening's presentation is focussed on Fraser Primary School, and in a moment we will hand over to provide you with a detailed overview of the TPV process.

Fist we will also share some of the schools planning approach more generally, to provide some context.

Regional Planning Approach

The Belconnen region is a key focus area for the Directorate's long term planning work.

The Government is taking steps to ensure that every child has access to great, accessible and sustainable facilities and school infrastructure that support high quality education in our rapidly growing city.

The Directorate undertakes demand response planning on an ongoing basis, through a regional approach to planning. Through a regional approach we can consider the needs, growth and capacity of each school individually as well as the region collectively.

We also take into account the long term multi decade demographic lifecycle of a catchment area, particularly in developing areas, such as the Belconnen Town Centre. We monitor residential development in the are (through monitoring EPSDD development application data and using ABS data sources such as Census data and Estimated Resident Population Data), to predict future enrolments into the public education system and plan to meet the enrolment demand through ensuring school capacity is available.

This ensures necessary future land and infrastructure needs are identified, planned, funded and built in the right place ready for use at the time it will be required. A regional approach allows the Directorate to test and design effective long term responses that maximise capacity of the overall region and best respond to future growth, while also taking into account circumstances of individual schools.

This regional planning work is in addition to the analysis, feasibility and planning work is continually underway and required for a range of projects to deliver new and expanded school capacity that responds to enrolment growth. This work is not always visible to the community when it is in the planning and development stages.

Education Directorate with WSP

All of our planning work is underpinned by our enrolment forecasting and modelling capability. The Directorate has a strategic partnership with the Australian National University School of Demography. Including the ANU in this work ensures a high level of integrity in enrolment projections and demography analysis, which forms a key input into schools planning from which investment decisions and planning responses are made.


We are continuing to monitor population and enrolment growth in Belconnen and we recognise now is the right time to take steps to expand the land at Fraser Primary School. I will now hand over to WSP to take us through the presentation.

What is proposed?

The Territory Plan provides the framework for land use and development within the ACT and is administered by the Planning and Development Act 2007. Changes to the Territory Plan are made via Territory Plan Variations ("TPVs").

Under the current planning framework, the Fraser Primary School site is zoned CFZ: Community Facilities and is within an area characterized by land zoned (and developed) for transport, sports and recreation, conservation and a mix of residential and commercial use.

The Fraser Primary School community is changing. Whilst there has not been a Government decision for a permanent expansion of the school, the Education Directorate has identified that there will be a need for additional space in the medium term. The undertaking of a TPV is the first part of the process to establish a new boundary for the school.

A rezoning of an area of approximately 1.4 hectares to the northeast of the existing school is proposed.





A variation to the Territory Plan is being proposed that would formally:

- Rezone a portion of Block 6, Section 64, Fraser from NUZ3: Hills, Ridges and Buffer Zone to CFZ: Community Facility Zone
- Amend the Fraser Precinct Code Fraser Precinct Map by extending the PD1 map area to include the subject land. No changes to the prohibited uses listed at Table 1 are proposed.

If approved, custodianship of the land affected by the variation would also be transferred from TCCS to the Education Directorate and incorporated into the Fraser Primary School site.

Dear Mr Barr

I am writing to you to express my great disappointment with the absence of accessible collaborative meaningful planning processes that are being undertaken by the Education Department in the apparent absence of ACT Planning and Environment Directorate affecting your Fraser constituents.

I have written to both Ms Yvette Berry Education Minister and Mr Gentleman Planning Minister and have not as yet received any communication response. I have also written to the third party engineering firm identified as WSP who appears to be running this process and have not had a response.

The first consultation was held yesterday evening via an online forum where a number of residents were unable to participate due to user unfriendly nature of the technology being used. A request to conduct the forum in a face to face Covid safe environment was made prior to the event and this was not facilitated under the guise of ACT government policy. Please provide the policy that was relied upon to facilitate a forum that was conducted online and excluded participants.

I perceived it became apparent that a decision had already been made in the absence of procedural fairness and natural justice. A number of questions were asked by the residents of Fraser and the responses in my opinion were inadequate or not answered at all.

I am asking you to confirm in writing that the process undertaken in rezoning the Fraser Primary School boundary is supported by legislation, policy, procedures and that you provide me with specific details of these that is being relied upon to carry out the expansion into protected grasslands and nature reserve where other land is available adjoining the school and is zoned to the school.

I was advised that the pre planning process was exempt from review of the ACT Administrative Tribunal. I perceive that the current process is flawed and fails to genuinely engage in community consultation as it lacks procedural fairness and natural justice and is non inclusive.

Frequently Asked Questions

Responses are provided below for the following questions which have been raised during the initial community consultation led by the Education Directorate.

Is a Traffic management plan part of the proposal and will there be impacts on local traffic management? No additional traffic is expected to be generated by this proposal. This proposal is seeking to expand the land boundary of the school grounds for students to access additional outdoor space and has no impacts on future enrolments.

Will there be any work to address parking and traffic congestion impacts during pickup and drop off times at the school?

The Education Directorate works closely with Transport Canberra and City Services (TCCS) to plan for and manage traffic impacts in the local area, particularly around peak periods during pick up and drop off times.

Are other land uses such as temporary or permanent infrastructure planned for this area?

No new buildings or facilities, either temporary or permanent are proposed as part of this re-zoning process. This proposal is seeking to expand the land boundary only.

If the TPV is approved, will there be a fence around the school?

No decisions have been made regarding the TPV proposal outcome. If a TPV goes ahead, the school Principal (together with the Education Directorate) will work with the school community to consider whether a fence is required in this area. This decision would be based on safety and operational impacts and would also consider impacts for the local community through consultation with nearby residents.

Will the community still be able to access this area if the TPV is approved?

If the TPV is approved, the land would be classified as a Community Facility Zone as part of the school. Access to this area during school hours would not be available to the general public. Schools also work closely with their local communities to provide access to facilities where possible. For schools with security fencing this means making arrangements with the community for appropriate outside school hours access, in accordance with the Education Directorate Community Use of School Facilities Policy.

- Why has this particular area been identified instead of other green spaces nearby?

The community oval to the south of the school is an important and established community asset that serves the entire suburb of Fraser for sport and recreation use. At times it is also accessed by the school. As it involves students access by crossing a public footpath additional supervision is required when this area is used by the school, to ensure student safety.

The area to the northeast of the school is well located for students to play outdoors in close proximity to their school. On balance, access to this particular site has been identified by the Directorate to be in the best interests of the Fraser Primary School and wider community.

Noting the boundary of the proposed site expansion is nearby local residences, is a 35 metre buffer between the boundary and the residential premises sufficient

Under this proposal, the 35m buffer is considered reasonable to provide a sufficient noise and distance barrier and also meets the requirement for a minimum setback of 6 metres under the Territory Plan.

Please see the following information about the community engagement process so far regarding the proposed Fraser Primary School TPV. I wanted to let you know there is a lack of support from a small number of neighbours who feel they will be directly impacted by the proposed TPV.

Transcript of questions raised last night also included far below.

Update on initial community consultation for the proposed Fraser Primary School Territory Plan Variation Process

EDU met with members of the community through two online opportunities:

- At the Belconnen Community Council meeting on 20 September, received one question about traffic impacts and congestion during pickup and drop off times.
- At a dedicated forum on 28 September 2022, attended by people who appeared to be local residents/neighbours who live in close proximity to the proposed expansion area. 50 minutes of questions were received.
- WSP has also received between 10-15 pieces of correspondence regarding the proposed TPV.
- Key themes have emerged from feedback received so far:
 - A desire from some local residents for the land to be retained as open space (including one ministerial correspondence currently with the MO for response, FILE2022/10926)
 - o Concern regarding traffic congestion impacts during pickup and drop off times at the school
 - Concern the expanded boundary will be fenced with an unattractive fence that will prevent access to the outdoor area outside of school hours (I spoke to the Community Use of school Facilities Policy & advised that no decisions have been made regarding the TPV or a fence, any potential future decision making regarding fencing would be in consultation with the school, Principal, P&C).
 - Queried whether other land uses are planned or temporary or permanent infrastructure on the site (No. Any future decision making would also be subject to statutory land planning requirements and decisions of Government).
 - Suggestion that instead of expanding this boundary, the school should claim the existing community oval instead & should consult the community on that proposed use (this land area was deemed to be in the best interests of the school and community noting the community value for existing community oval assets).

In response, I advised community members that this proposal and particular site was selected as, on balance, it is deemed to be in the best interests of the Fraser Primary School community (as well as the interests of the surrounding community through also preserving established open space/playing fields at the community oval).

Next steps

- The engagement period will end on 12 October 2022, as foreshadowed to the community.
- EDU will develop responses to these themes which could be included on the Directorate & Fraser Primary School websites.
- Comments from the engagement process will be considered and collated/presented to the Environment, Planning and Sustainable Development Directorate (EPSDD) with a Planning Report supporting the proposed Territory Plan Variation, expected to be complete by the end of 2022.
- EPSDD will consider the proposal and conduct a formal consultation on a draft Variation to the Territory Plan in 2023, including making these reports available and consulting other ACT Government agencies for comment.

- Is a traffic management plan a part of the proposal? Parking on Tillyard Drive is dangerous around school time the shoulder is not even wide enough for a car.
- Would the space be fenced and therefore not able to be used by the public?
- Would the fence boundaries be moved, how do we do that if there is a fence? Surely residents living locally do not get a key?
- Why not utilise the oval next to the site? This was raised a number of times with a few members feeling very strongly that that site should be used instead.

- Community use regarding the outdoor area especially if it is fenced?

Chat comments

- "For the sake of 90 minutes play time for students, residents will be looking at an 8ft high black fence all day every day and have restricted access to that green space. You can't tell me that the school will agree to leave open a fenced site on the weekends"
- " , having students play in an unfenced place open to the public is a disaster I have found broken glass, syringes, rusted metal in these open spaces The school will be locking that fence guaranteed"
- "In my opinion this is simply unacceptable we don't want our property views, outlook and environment to be adversely impacted"
- "There are a number of residents, specifically the owners directly adjacent the 35m buffer zone would not have access to teams"
- "The Education Department however isn't the Planning Department. At one point can the residents seek to review the ACT Education decision to rezone the boundary zone"

Please see below for suggested edits in blue. There was a comment regarding procedural fairness/judicial review in the draft via the ACAT. Should commentary regarding any procedural fairness/judicial review be included – we strongly recommend that they be directed to the ACT Government's internal legal counsel in the first instance, noting that it falls outside our expertise in statutory planning.

A decision on a Territory Plan variation is not appealable in ACAT because it is not listed as a reviewable decision under the Planning and Development Act 2007 or the Planning and Development Regulation 2008. Conventional draft variations follow a process whereby they are publicly notified for comment, referred to the Standing Committee and debated at the Legislative Assembly prior to their gazettal.

Through the Standing Committee on Planning, Transport, and City Services, the committee can undertake a public inquiry regarding a specific draft variation. Once the committee process concludes, the Minister for Planning will make decision to either approval or reject the variation. It will then be presented to and debated at the Legislative Assembly ("the LA"). Once it passes the LA, it is considered approved and can be commenced any time. As a draft variation has to be assessed by the Planning and Land Authority, pass the Standing Committee and the Legislative Assembly, the decision on approving a TP variation is not appealable at ACAT.
