Government School Bulletin

August 2003 Census

Overview

On 1 August 2003 the ACT Government Schools Census was conducted. The Census indicated that a total of 36,739 students attended 95¹ schools. This represents a decrease of 613 students, or 1.64%, since August 2002.

A total of 20,212 students attended 69¹ government primary schools. This represents a decrease of 605 students, or 2.91%, since August 2002.

A total of 10,326 students attended 17¹ government high schools. This represents an increase of 41 students, or 0.40%, since August 2002.

A total of 5,874 students attended 8 government secondary colleges. This represents a decrease of 77 students, or 1.29%, since August 2002.

A total of 327 students attended 4 government special schools. This represents an increase of 28 students, or 9.36%, since August 2002.

ACT government schools census data was electronically downloaded.

4. Student Enrolments

The census includes students enrolled in a government school on census day.

5. Special Schools

Special schools cater for students with intellectual and physical disabilities, or who are emotionally and/or behaviourally disturbed.

6. Introductory English Centres (IEC)


IECs are for students who require intensive full time English language instruction.

In August 2003

Total primary school enrolments were 20,212. This includes 1,425 primary school students enrolled at combined primary/high schools. (In August 2002, the figures were 20,817 (including Jervis Bay) and 1,449 respectively.) Total high school enrolments were 10,326. This includes 1,708 high school students enrolled at combined primary/high schools. (In August 2002, the figures were 10,285 and 1,675 respectively.)

The three combined schools are Telopea Park School, Gold Creek School and the Wanniassa School.

Note: The ACT Department of Education, Youth and Family Services administers Jervis Bay Primary School for the Commonwealth under a service agreement.
