Government School Bulletin

February 2003 Census

Overview

On 19 February 2003 the ACT Government Schools Census was conducted. The Census indicated that a total of 37,192 students attended 95¹ schools. This represents a decrease of 416 students, or 1.11%, since February 2002.

A total of 20,266 students attended 69¹ government primary schools. This represents a decrease of 493 students, or 2.37%, since February 2002.

A total of 10,349 students attended 17^1 government high schools. This represents an increase of 61 students, or 0.59%, since February 2002.

A total of 6,261 students attended 8 government secondary colleges. This represents a decrease of 15 students, or 0.24%, since February 2002.

A total of 316 students attended 4 government special schools. This represents an increase of 31 students, or 10.88%, since February 2002.

¹ This includes three schools that have both primary and high school students.

ACT government schools census data was electronically downloaded.

4. Student Enrolments

The census includes students enrolled in a government school on census day.

5. Special Schools

Special schools cater for students with intellectual and physical disabilities, or who are emotionally and/or behaviourally disturbed.


6. Introductory English Centres (IEC)

In February 2003

Total primary school enrolments were 20,266. This includes 1,433 primary school students enrolled at combined primary/high schools. (In February 2002, the figures were 20,759 (including Jervis Bay) and 1,424 respectively.)

Total high school enrolments were 10,349. This includes 1,710 high school students enrolled at combined primary/high schools. (In February 2002, the figures were 10,288 and 1,662 respectively.)

The three combined schools are Telopea Park School, Gold Creek School and the Wanniassa School.

Note: The ACT Department of Education, Youth and Family Services administers Jervis Bay Primary School for the Commonwealth under a service agreement.
