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PARTIES: AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY, the body politic established by section 7 of the *Australian Capital Territory (Self-Government) Act 1988* (Cth) (Territory) represented by the Education and Training Directorate.

BACKGROUND

- A. As part of the Territory's initiative to support non-government preschools to provide high quality early childhood education, the Territory will offer capital grants to help establish and upgrade Preschools through its Supporting Non-Government Preschools Capital Grants Program (Capital Grants Program).
- B. Pursuant to the Master Funding Agreement, BGA has agreed to administer the Capital Grants Program on behalf of the Territory including the management of the grant applications process and payment of the Grant on completion of the relevant milestones and activities as set out in the Schedule 2.
- C. The School has submitted an application to BGA for funding to undertake the Capital Works at the Site.
- D. The Territory has agreed to make and the School has agreed to accept the Grant for the purpose of completing the Capital Works at the Site on the terms and conditions of this Deed.

IT IS AGREED by the parties as follows.

1. Interpretation

1.1 Definitions

The following definitions apply in this Deed, unless the context otherwise requires:

Approval	means any licence, permit, consent, approval, determination, certificate or other requirement necessary for the lawful construction of the Capital Works.
BGA	means the ACT Block Grant Authority Inc ABN 21 292 628 376, acting in its capacity as agent for the Territory.
BGA Contact Officer	means BGA's representative whose name and contact details are specified in Item 3 Schedule 1 , or as notified in writing from time to time by the Territory.
Building Code of Australia	means the Building Code of Australia produced and maintained by the Australian Building Codes Board on behalf of the Australian Government and State and Territory Governments as amended from time to time.
Business Day	in relation to the doing of any action in a place, means any day other than a Saturday, Sunday, public holiday or bank

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	holiday in that place.
Capital Works	means the capital works to be undertaken by the School as part of the Capital Works Program which are summarised in Schedule 2 and which will result in the completed or upgraded Preschool (as the case may be).
Certificate of Occupancy	means an unqualified certificate of occupancy issued by the relevant authority under the <i>Building Act 2004</i> (ACT) that the Capital Works are fit for occupancy and the Designated Use.
Contact Officer	in relation to each party, means the representatives whose names and contact details are specified in Item 3 Schedule 1, or as notified in writing from time to time by one party to the other.
Date for Commencement of Capital Works	means the date for commencement of the Capital Works specified in Item 3 Schedule 2 or as otherwise agreed by the Territory in writing.
Date for Commencement of the Preschool	means the date for commencement of the Preschool specified in Item 3 Schedule 2 or as otherwise agreed by the Territory in writing.
Date for Practical Completion	means the date by which the School must achieve Practical Completion of the Capital Works or as otherwise agreed by the Territory in writing.
Designated Use	means the designated use specified in Item 1 Schedule 2.
Designated Use Period	commences on the Date for Commencement of the Preschool and ends on the day which is 10 years from the Date for Commencement of the Preschool.
Expiry Date	means the date on which the Designated Use Period ends.
Force Majeure Event	means a circumstance or event which was not contemplated by the School and which could not reasonably have been foreseen by the School and is beyond School's reasonable control, including acts of God, war or other hostility, national or international disaster, fire, explosion, power failure, strike or lockout, but does not include circumstances or events caused by acts or omissions of the School's officers, employees, sub- contractors or agents.
Grant	means the amount specified in Item 1 Schedule 1 and any interest accruing on that amount after it has been paid to
	the School.

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Grant Period	has the meaning set out in clause 6.

- (4) is rendered at the times specified in Item 2 Schedule 1 (if any) and addressed to BGA's Contact Officer.

- **Reports** means any report of other notification required to be provided to BGA or the Territory (as the case may be) in accordance with **clause 11**.
- Site means the location at which the Capital Works will be undertaken as specified in Item 1 of Schedule 2.
- **Territory** when used:
 - (1) in a geographical sense, means the Australian Capital Territory; and
 - (2) in any other sense, means the body politic established by section 7 of the Australian Capital Territory (Self-Government) Act 1988 (Cth).

1.2 General

In this Deed, unless a contrary intention is expressed:

- (1) references to a party includes any employee, agent or subcontractor of that party;
- (2) references to legislation or to provisions in legislation include references to amendments or re-enactments of them and to all regulations and instruments issued under the legislation;
- (3) words in the singular include the plural and vice versa;
- (4) headings are for convenience only and do not affect the construction or interpretation of this Deed;
- (5) an obligation imposed on more than one person binds them jointly and severally;
- (6) where a word or phrase is given a defined meaning, any other part of speech

or other grammatical form of that word or phrase has a corresponding meaning; and

(7) the word "include" and any derivation of that word is to be construed without limitation.

2. Capital Works Phase

2.1 Planning, design and Approvals

The School is responsible for the planning and design of the Capital Works and must ensure that all documents necessary to complete the planning and design of the Capital Works are properly developed and are fit for purpose. The School must provide any such documents to BGA promptly upon request by BGA.

2.2 Approvals

The School must obtain all Approvals for:

- (1) the construction of the Capital Works; and
- (2) the use of the Capital Works for the Designated Use,

and must deliver copies of the each Approval to BGA promptly upon request by BGA.

3. Performance of the Capital Works

3.1 Commencement of Capital Works

The School agrees to commence the Capital Works, or to ensure the Capital Works are commenced on or before the Date for Commencement of Capital Works unless the Territory otherwise agrees in writing or unless commencement is prevented by a Force Majeure Event.

3.2 School Obligations

The School must ensure the Capital Works are carried out:

- (1) in accordance with the Approvals;
- (2) in accordance with Item 2 Schedule 2;
- (3) diligently, effectively and to a high professional standard; and
- (4) so as to ensure that the Preschool will be fit for the Designated Use during the Designated Use Period.

3.3 Acceptance of risk for Capital Works

The School accepts all risks in respect of the conduct and completion of the Capital Works including, without limitation, all risks of and associated with the design, construction and completion of the Capital Works, including in relation to any budget over-runs.

3.4 Construction Standards

The School must ensure that:

- all aspects of the Capital Works are undertaken by qualified tradespeople or professionals who are registered with relevant Territory accreditation bodies to the extent that such bodies exist to regulate the activities of members of that particular trade or profession;
- (2) all activity relating to the Capital Works is carried out in accordance with the requirements and standards of all statutory requirements applicable to the building, construction and fit out of the Site; and
- (3) the Capital Works comply with the requirements of the Building Code of Australia and all relevant Australian Standards.

3.5 Variations to Capital Works

- (1) The School must notify BGA in writing of all proposed variations to the Capital Works that would or might reasonably be expected to have an effect on:
 - (a) the cost of the Capital Works;
 - (b) the timeframes for completion of the Capital Works, including the Date for Practical Completion;
 - (c) the fitness of the completed Capital Works for the Designated Use; or
 - (d) the Approvals obtained in relation to the Capital Works.
- (2) The School must ensure that any notification under clause 3.5(1) (Variation **Proposal**):
 - (a) is signed by a duly authorised officer of the School;
 - (b) clearly explains what variation is proposed and why (including specifying its effect on each relevant item set out in clause 3.5(1)); and
 - (c) explains the impact (if any) that the variation or departure will have on the outcomes of this Deed.
- (3) The Territory will consider the Variation Proposal, and will, within 20 Business Days of such Variation Proposal being provided to BGA and in the Territory's absolute discretion:
 - (a) approve the Variation Proposal;
 - (b) not approve the Variation Proposal; or
 - (c) take such other action with respect to the Variation Proposal as the Territory determines appropriate, which may include notifying the School of further matters which the Territory requires the School to address in order for the Variation Proposal to be approved by the Territory.
- (4) On receipt of notification under **clause 3.5(3)(c)**, the School must promptly amend the Variation Proposal as required by the Territory and resubmit it for re-consideration by the Territory in accordance with **clause 3.5(2)**.

- (5) Any Variation Proposal approved by the Territory under clause 3.5(3)(a) will be attached to and form part of this Deed.
- (6) The School must not vary the Capital Works in respect of a matter referred to in **clause 3.5(1)** without the Territory's approval in writing of a Variation Proposal.
- (7) For the avoidance of doubt, the Territory and BGA will not and are not under any obligation to, provide funds additional to the Grant where the Territory receives or approves a Variation Proposal.

3.6 **Requirements for Practical Completion**

In order to achieve Practical Completion:

- (1) the Capital Works must be:
 - (a) complete and free from errors, defects or omissions except for errors, defects or omissions that:
 - (i) are of a minor nature;
 - (ii) the immediate making good of which by the School is not reasonably practicable;
 - (iii) the existence of which or the making good of which by the School will not significantly inconvenience the use of the Capital Works for the Designated Use; and
 - (iv) which do not cause any legal or physical impediment to the use and occupation of the Site and the Capital Works for the Designated Use;
 - (b) fit for use for the Designated Use; and
- (2) the School must:
 - (a) provide written certification to BGA from a representative authorised by the School who:
 - (i) is appropriately qualified to provide such certification (as specified in **clause 3.7**); and
 - (ii) has inspected the Capital Works on their completion; or
 - (b) otherwise have proven, in written form and to the satisfaction of BGA in accordance with BGA procedures,

that the Capital Works meet the requirements set out in clause 3.6(1).

3.7 Qualifications for Authorised Representative

For the purposes of clause 3.6(2)(a)(i), the representative authorised by the School must be:

(1) a qualified architect registered with the Architects Board or other equivalent professional organisation satisfactory to BGA; or

- (2) a builder licensed under the construction occupation licensing legislation in force in the Territory; or
- (3) a qualified engineer registered with the National Professional Engineers Register or other equivalent professional organisation satisfactory to BGA.

3.8 Date for Practical Completion of Capital Works

The School must achieve Practical Completion on or before the Date for Practical Completion except where Practical Completion is prevented by a Force Majeure Event.

3.9 Certificate of Occupancy

The School must provide to BGA a copy of the Certificate of Occupancy on or before the Date for Commencement of the Preschool.

3.10 Force Majeure

- (1) Where a Force Majeure Event occurs which has affected, or which the School considers is reasonably likely to affect, the School's ability to ensure that the Capital Works are:
 - (a) commenced by the Date for Commencement of Capital Works; or
 - (b) completed by the Date for Practical Completion,

the School must:

- (c) notify BGA of the Force Majeure Event and its affect or likely affect on the Practical Completion as well as its likely duration and the steps being taken by the School to overcome the Force Majeure event; and
- (d) take all reasonable steps, and use its best endeavours, to remove, overcome or minimise the effects of the Force Majeure Event and ensure the Capital Works are commenced, or completed, as the case may be, as soon as is practicable.
- (2) For the avoidance of doubt, the School will not be entitled to any payment of the Grant which is linked to the School's commencement of or Practical Completion of (as the case may be) the Capital Works to the extent that a Force Majeure Event prevents the School from commencing or completing (as the case may be) the Capital Works, unless otherwise agreed by the Territory in writing.

4. Payment and use of Grant

4.1 Payment of Grant to School

The BGA will pay the Grant to the School at the times and in the manner specified in **Item 1 of Schedule 1** and using its own procedures to disperse the Grant ensuring the School has met appropriate milestones and subject to:

- (1) the School's compliance with this Deed; and
- (2) clause 5.1.

4.2 No provision of additional funds to meet project over-runs

- (1) Without limiting **clause 3.3**, the School accept the risk of the actual cost of the design, construction and completion of the Capital Works for the Preschool being greater than anticipated by the School.
- (2) The Territory will not, and is under no obligation to, provide to BGA on the School's behalf any funds additional to the Grant (and BGA will not, and is under no obligation to, provide to the School any funds additional to the Grant) including where the actual cost of the design, construction and completion of the Capital Works is greater than anticipated, or where BGA receive or approve a Variation Proposal under **clause 3.5**.

4.3 Use of Grant

The School must use the Grant only for the Capital Works and otherwise in accordance with the provisions of this Deed.

5. Withholding, repayment and recovery of Grant

5.1 Where the Territory and BGA are not required to make payments

- (1) Without limiting any other rights the Territory may have under this Deed, or the Territory's and BGA's rights at general law:
 - (a) the Territory is not required to pay BGA the Grant; and
 - (b) BGA is not required to pay the School the Grant;

if the School is in breach of this Deed.

- (2) For the purposes of **clause 5.1(1)**, the School will be in breach of this Deed including in circumstances where the School:
 - (a) does not undertake or perform the Capital Works as required by this Deed (including by not meeting relevant timeframes);
 - (b) undertakes or performs the Capital Works other than as allowed for by this Deed;
 - (c) does not provide Reports or other information as required by, or pursuant to, this Deed (or does not provide such Reports or other information in the timeframe required by this Deed); or
 - (d) expends the Grant other than in accordance with the requirements of this Deed.

5.2 The Territory's right to repayment of the Grant where the Preschool is not used for Designated Use

- (1) Where the School has failed to comply with its obligations under **clause** 7, the Territory may, in the Territory's absolute discretion, recover from the School an amount of the Grant calculated in accordance with the formula set out in **clause 5.2(2)**.
- (2) For the purposes of **clause 5.2(1)**, the formula is as follows:

Recoverable amount = $G - [G/10 \times Y]$

where G is the total amount of the Grant paid to the School (excluding any such amounts that have already been recovered by BGA or the Territory); and

Y is the number of completed years since the commencement of the Designated Use Period, as at the time the School first failed to comply with its obligations at **clause 7**.

(3) For the avoidance of doubt, where the School first fails to comply with its obligations under **clause** 7 within one year of the commencement of Designated Use Period, the Territory may recover in full the total amount of Grant paid to the School and which has not already been recovered by BGA or the Territory.

5.3 Repayment of Grant

- (1) Without limiting any other clause in this Deed, the School agrees that the Territory may recover from the School any amount of the Grant that the School has not spent or committed in accordance with this Deed as at Date for Commencement of the Preschool or date of earlier termination of this Deed.
- (2) Without limiting any other clause in this Deed, the School agrees that the Territory may require the School to repay an amount equivalent to any amount of the Grant that the School has:
 - (a) spent other than in accordance with this Deed; or
 - (b) not acquitted to the Territory's reasonable satisfaction;

at any time where the Territory provides the School with a notice in writing that the School is required to repay such amount.

5.4 Territory and BGA may defer, suspend, reduce or withhold payments

Without limiting any other rights the Territory may have under this Deed, or at general law, the Territory may defer, suspend, reduce or withhold all or part of the Grant to the BGA for the School, and BGA will accordingly defer, suspend, reduce or withhold all or part of the Grant to the School:

- (1) until the School has performed to the Territory's satisfaction the obligation to which the Grant relates; or
- (2) where the Territory forms the reasonable opinion that the full payment is not properly required by the School because of Grant surpluses or underspends.

5.5 Recoverable amounts must be repaid or offset

- Subject to clause 5.5(2), where any amount is recoverable by the Territory under this Deed, including an amount recoverable under clauses 5.2, 5.3 or 5.4 (Recoverable Amount), the School agrees to pay the Recoverable Amount to the Territory or as otherwise directed by the Territory, in full within 21 Business Days of a request in writing from the Territory to do so.
- (2) If the Territory agrees in writing that the School does not have to pay all or some of the Recoverable Amount to the Territory, then the School does not have to pay the Territory that amount the Territory agrees to, but:
 - (a) the Territory may recover all or some of the Recoverable Amount

from the School by offsetting the amount against any amount subsequently due to the School under this Deed, or any other arrangement or agreement between the School and the Territory; or

(b) the Territory may request the School in writing to deal with all or some of the Recoverable Amount in a particular way, and the School agrees to deal with such amount as the Territory requests.

5.6 Amounts unpaid are debts due to the Territory

- If:
- (1) the School does not pay the Territory an amount owing under clause 5.5(1); or
- (2) the Territory is not able to recover an amount the Territory wishes to recover under **clause 5.5(2)(a)**; or
- the School does not deal with an amount as the Territory directs under clause 5.5(2)(b);

then:

- (4) the School must pay the amount arising under clauses 5.6(1), 5.6(2), or 5.6(3) to the Territory and must also pay the Territory Interest on such amount from the date it was due to be paid, or offset or dealt with as the case may be, and then for the period of time it remains unpaid to the Territory; and
- (5) the relevant amount, and Interest owed under **clause 5.6(4)**, will be recoverable by the Territory as a debt due to the Territory by the School.

6. Grant Period

This Deed commences on the Date of this Deed and ends on the Expiry Date, unless terminated earlier in accordance with the terms of this Deed.

7. Obligations during Designated Use Period

7.1 Maintenance, upkeep and insurance obligations

At all times during the Designated Use Period the School must, at its own cost:

- (1) safeguard the Preschool and any associated equipment against loss, damage or unauthorised use;
- (2) maintain the Preschool in good condition;
- (3) reinstate the Preschool and any associated equipment if it is damaged or destroyed; and
- (4) without limiting **clause 14**, effect and maintain appropriate insurance in respect of the Preschool.

7.2 Designated Use Obligations

At all times during the Designated Use Period the School must:

(1) use the Preschool, or ensure the Preschool is used, for the Designated Use;

- (2) not use the Preschool, or permit the Preschool to be used, in a way that would have the effect of preventing the Preschool being used for the Designated Use; and
- (3) not dispose of the Site or any part of the Site.

8. Separate accounting for Grant

8.1 Separately account for Grant

The School must, within its accounting system, account for the Grant separately from any other funds of the School.

8.2 Bank account

The School must ensure that the Grant, once provided to the School by the BGA, is held in an account in the School's name and which the School solely controls, with a bank or credit union authorised by the Australian Prudential Regulatory Authority to carry on banking business in Australia.

9. GST

9.1 Definitions

Expressions in this **clause 9** which are not defined in this Deed but which are defined in the GST Act have the same meaning as in the GST Act.

9.2 Consideration is Exclusive of GST

Unless otherwise expressly stated, all amounts, prices, values or other sums payable or to be provided under this Deed are exclusive of GST.

9.3 GST On Taxable Supply

If GST is payable on any supply made under this Deed:

- (1) the recipient of the taxable supply must pay to the supplier an amount equal to the GST payable on the taxable supply in addition to and at the same time as payment for the taxable supply is required to be made under this Deed; and
- (2) the supplier must give the recipient a tax invoice for the taxable supply.

10. Records

10.1 Obligation to keep records

The School must:

- (1) keep all records necessary to substantiate expenditure of the Grant in compliance with applicable laws;
- (2) provide a complete and detailed record and explanation of:
 - (a) expenditure of the Grant;
 - (b) other money received and spent on the Capital Works;
 - (c) the progress of the Capital Works; and

(d) any other records in respect of the Capital Works;

that the Territory may reasonably require from time to time; and

(3) retain the records referred to in this clause for at least 7 years following the completion of the Capital Works or the expiration or termination of this Deed, whichever occurs first.

10.2 Access

- (1) To audit the School's compliance with this Deed, the Territory may, at reasonable times and on reasonable notice, enter the School's premises and inspect the records kept by the School and the progress of the Capital Works.
- (2) The School must:
 - (a) give the Territory access to those facilities and such assistance as may reasonably be necessary to enable the Territory to conduct an audit under **clause 10.2(1)**; and
 - (b) permit the Territory, at its own cost, to take copies of any records which it reasonably considers relevant to its audit.

10.3 Territory's Auditor-General

Any of the Territory's rights under this **clause 10** may be exercised by the Territory's Auditor-General, her delegate or any relevantly qualified person engaged to perform any functions of the Auditor-General.

11. Reporting of progress and expenditure

11.1 Progress Report

The School must provide to BGA written reports relating to the progress of the Capital Works and expenditure of the Grant (**Progress Report**) in the manner and at the times required in **Schedule 2**.

11.2 Final Acquittal Report

- (1) The School must provide to BGA an audited final acquittal report (Final Acquittal Report) in the manner and at the time required in Schedule 2.
- (2) The Final Acquittal Report must be prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards.
- (3) The Final Acquittal Report must be audited:
 - (a) in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards; and
 - (b) by a person who is:
 - (i) registered as a company auditor under the *Corporations Act* 2001 (Cth), or a member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia, or of CPA Australia or the National Institute of Accountants; and
 - (ii) not a principal, member, shareholder, officer or employee of

the School.

11.3 Designated Use Period Report

If requested by the Territory, the School must provide to the Territory a written report relating to the use of the Preschool for the Designated Use (**Designated Use Period Report**) in the manner and at the times required in **Schedule 2**.

11.4 Other notifications

The School must keep BGA reasonably informed about all matters which are likely to materially and adversely affect the timing, scope or cost of the Capital Works or the School's ability to carry on or complete the Capital Works in accordance with this Deed.

12. Acknowledgement of Funding

12.1 Acknowledgement of Territory support

The School must in relation to the Capital Works:

- (1) acknowledge the support of the Territory in any public event, media release or media coverage; and
- if requested by the Territory, erect a commemorative plaque in a prominent position on the Preschool with the form of acknowledgement set out in Item 4 Schedule 1.

12.2 Other obligations

The School must:

- (1) in relation to the material referred to in **clause 12.1(1)**, promptly provide to the Territory:
 - (a) if required under Item 4 Schedule 1, or as otherwise requested by the Territory, a draft of that material at least 10 Business Days prior to publishing or printing; and
 - (b) a copy of that material;
- (2) on reasonable notice, invite the Territory to participate in any public event, media release or media coverage related to the Capital Works.

13. Intellectual Property Rights

13.1 Ownership of Grant Material

Ownership of all Grant Material, including any intellectual property rights, vests on its creation in the School.

13.2 Licence to Territory

The School grants to the Territory an irrevocable, non-exclusive, royalty-free licence to use the Grant Material including to supply, reproduce, publish, perform, communicate, broadcast, adapt and copy the Grant Material.

14. Insurance and Indemnity

14.1 School's insurance

The School must effect and maintain for the Term all insurance coverage required to be effected by it by law, and insurance of the types and in amounts not less than the amounts (if any) specified by **Item 2 Schedule 1**, with an insurer that is authorised by the Australian Prudential Regulation Authority to conduct new or renewal insurance business in Australia and rated at AA or better by Standard & Poor's.

14.2 Indemnity

The School indemnifies the Territory, its employees and agents against liability in respect of all claims, costs and expenses in relation to all loss, damage, injury or death to persons or property caused by the School, its employees, agents or contractors in connection with the conduct of the Capital Works or this Deed, except to the extent that the Territory caused or contributed to the relevant loss, damage or injury.

15. Termination of Grant

15.1 Default

The Territory may terminate this Deed at any time by written notice to the School, if the School:

- (1) is the subject of an Insolvency Event;
- (2) fails to undertake the Capital Works diligently and in a timely manner, having regard to any timeframes specified in this Deed; or
- (3) is in breach of a provision of this Deed, where that breach:
 - (a) if capable of being remedied, is not remedied within the period specified in a written notice by the Territory, or
 - (b) is not capable of being remedied.

15.2 No prejudice

Nothing in this **clause 15** prejudices any other rights or remedies of the Territory in respect of any breach of this Deed.

16. Termination of Master Funding Agreement

16.1 Territory's rights where Master Funding Agreement is terminated

Where, for any reason, the Master Funding Agreement is terminated, the Territory may:

- (1) terminate this Deed under **clause 15**;
- (2) make payments of the Grant directly to the School, where the School has met the conditions relevant to the payment **in Schedule 1** to the Territory's satisfaction;
- (3) direct another party (including, but not limited to, BGA) to make payments of the Grant to the School, where the School has met the conditions relevant to

the payment in Schedule 1 to the Territory's satisfaction; or

(4) take such other action with respect to this Deed as the Territory, acting reasonably, determines is necessary and appropriate.

16.2 Consultation with School

In making any decision under **clause 16.1**, the Territory will consult with the School where the Territory considers such consultation is necessary and appropriate.

17. Dispute Resolution

- (1) If a difference or dispute (**Dispute**) arises in relation to this Deed, then either party to the Dispute may give written notice to the other that a Dispute exists, which specifies details of the Dispute, and the parties agree that they will endeavour to resolve the Dispute by negotiations, or, if the Dispute has not been resolved within 28 days of the issue of the notice, undertake mediation with an independent mediator, the cost to be shared by the parties to the Dispute unless otherwise agreed.
- (2) Nothing in this **clause 17** will prejudice the rights of either party to institute proceedings to enforce this Deed or to seek injunctive or urgent declaratory relief in respect of any Dispute.

18. Variation

This Deed may only be varied by the written agreement of the parties prior to the expiration of the Grant Period.

19. General

19.1 No assignment

The School must not assign the whole or any part of this Deed without the prior written consent of the Territory. If the Territory gives its consent, the Territory may impose any conditions.

19.2 Conflict of interest

The School warrants that at the start of the Grant Period no conflict of interest exists or is likely to arise in the performance of the Capital Works and of its other obligations under this Deed and must, if a conflict or risk of conflict of interest arises during the Grant Period, notify the Territory immediately in writing and comply with any requirement of the Territory to eliminate or otherwise deal with that conflict or risk.

19.3 No employment, partnership or agency relationship

Nothing in this Deed constitutes the School, or its employees, agents or subcontractors as employees, partners or agents of the Territory, or creates any employment, partnership or agency for any purpose and the School must not represent itself, and must ensure its employees, agents and subcontractors do not represent themselves, as being employees, partners or agents of the Territory.

19.4 Entire agreement

This Deed comprises the entire agreement between the parties in relation to the Grant

and the Capital Works and supersedes any prior representations, negotiations, writings, memoranda and agreements.

19.5 Severability

Any provision of this Deed that is illegal, void or unenforceable will not form part of this Deed to the extent of that illegality, voidness or unenforceability. The remaining provisions of this Deed will not be invalidated by an illegal, void or unenforceable provision.

19.6 No waiver

Failure or omission by a party at any time to enforce or require strict or timely compliance with any provision of this Deed will not affect or impair that provision in any way or the rights and remedies that party may have in respect of that provision.

19.7 Compliance with laws and governing law

This Deed is governed by and construed in accordance with the law for the time being in force in the Territory and the parties submit to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of the Territory. The School must comply with the laws from time to time in force in the Territory in conducting the Capital Works.

19.8 Notices

Any notice, including any other communication, required to be given or sent to party under this Deed must be in writing and given to the relevant Contact Officer. A notice will be deemed to have been given:

- (1) if delivered by hand, on delivery;
- (2) if sent by prepaid mail, on the expiration of two days after the date on which it was sent;
- (3) if sent by facsimile, on the sender's facsimile machine recording that the facsimile has been successfully and properly transmitted to the School's address; or
- (4) if sent by electronic mail, on whichever of the following occurs first:
 - (a) the other party's acknowledgment of receipt by any means,
 - (b) the sender's electronic mail device recording that the electronic mail has been successfully transmitted to the School's address, or
 - (c) expiration of two business days after the date on which it was sent without receipt of a notification that the delivery failed,

and if given in two or more ways, on the first of paragraphs (1) to (4) occurring.

19.9 Forms and statements

The Territory may reasonably require any form, record or statement required under this Deed to be in a particular form.

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19.10 Survival of clauses

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(1) **Clauses 13, 14.2** and this **clause 19.10** will survive the expiration or earlier termination of this Deed.

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(2) **Clause 10.1(3)** applies during the Grant Period and for 7 years from the Expiry Date or earlier termination of this Deed.



In the course of the registration process a school's compliance with these criteria are assessed. Orana Steiner School, having met the criteria of registration, is registered until 31 December 2018 and has applied for registration renewal.

ORANA STEINER SCHOOL – APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION RENEWAL – KINDERGARTEN – YEAR 12

Registration process and panel report

Orana Steiner School (OSS or the school) is registered as an ACT non-government school for kindergarten to year 12 for the period 1 January 2017 to 31 December 2018, a period of two years. Non-government schools are generally registered for five year periods (the maximum period under the Education Act 2004) because they are able to provide evidence of compliance with all the conditions of registration. Due to concerns with financial viability and Board of Senior Secondary Studies (BSSS) hours, OSS was registered for 2017 and 2018 only, on the condition that the BSSS concerns were rectified prior to the commencement of classes in 2017. The school was found to be compliant with all other registration conditions and the BSSS confirmed the school's compliance in early 2017.

In February 2018, under section (Sn) 96 of the *Education Act 2004* (the Act) the proprietor of OSS applied for registration renewal for three years, and requested a variation to the registration process so that the 2018 registration panel only consider current evidence against the two non-compliant criteria (financial viability and BSSS hours). This request was approved by the Registrar of non-Government schools and the 2018 panel consequently only examined the school's compliance with criterion (b i – BSSS requirements) and (g – financial viability).

Under Sn 97 of the Act a panel was appointed to report to the Minister on the application. The following table summarises the panel's findings against the registration criteria. A comprehensive report follows.

Criterion A – Proprietor

Requirement

The proprietor of the school is and remains a corporation.

Registration panel comment

The 2016 panel considered the information/documentation provided by the school and was of the opinion that the school met the requirement.

Criterion B – Policies, facilities and equipment

Requirement

The school must have appropriate policies, facilities and equipment for the curriculum offered by the school and the safety and the welfare of its students.

Registration panel comment

(i) – curriculum

The 2016 registration panel found that OSS was fully compliant with this criterion with the exception of BSSS requirements for year 11 and 12 study as they related to the provision of 55 hours per BSSS curriculum for Tertiary, Accredited and Modified units.

This non-compliance was one of the reasons the school's registration was previously renewed for 2017 and 2018 only rather than the maximum five year period.

The 2018 registration panel found that whilst meeting all other BSSS requirements, OSS still did not meet the BSSS requirements for minimum hours for all units and courses.

The 2018 panel recommends that the school be required to demonstrate full compliance with the BSSS' mandatory subject hour requirements before the commencement of classes in 2019.

(ii) - safety and welfare

The 2016 registration panel found that OSS was fully compliant with this criterion. During 2018 the school provided to the Education Directorate copies of its safety and welfare policies. The Directorate confirmed that these are consistent with policies held by other ACT independent schools.

Criterion C – Curriculum framework

Requirement

The school's curriculum (including the framework of the curriculum and the principles on which the curriculum is based) must meet the curriculum requirements for students attending government schools. The curriculum requirements for students attending government schools are:

- implementation of the Australian curriculum according to the ACT's implementation plan;
- compliance, where relevant, with BSSS requirements for year 11 and 12 courses;
- kindergarten to year 10 students to engage in regular moderate to vigorous physical activity; and
- Year 3-8 students to study of one of the ACT's eight priority languages (French, German, Italian, Spanish, Indonesian, Japanese, Chinese/Mandarin and Korean) or other language approved by the Registrar of Nongovernment schools.

Registration panel comment

The 2016 registration panel found that OSS was fully compliant with this criterion.

Criterion D - Nature and content of the education

Requirement

The nature and content of the education offered at the school is to be appropriate for the educational levels for which the school is registered.

Registration panel comment

The 2018 panel considered the 2016 registration panel report. The 2018 panel is of the view that the school meets the requirement.

Criterion E – Teaching staff qualifications

Requirement

Teaching staff are to be qualified to teach at the educational levels at which they are employed to teach.

Registration panel comment

The 2018 panel considered the 2016 registration panel report. The 2018 panel is of the view that the school meets the requirement.

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Criterion F – Monitoring educational outcomes

Requirement

The school must have satisfactory processes to monitor quality educational outcomes.

Registration panel comment

The 2018 panel considered the 2016 registration panel report. The 2018 panel is of the view that the school meets the requirement.

Criterion G - Financial viability

Requirement

The school must be financially viable.

The following documentation was provided for the consideration of the panel member responsible for the financial viability assessment of the school:

- G-1 Copies of all insurances
- G-2 Copies of current business plans including projected enrolments, staffing, income and expenditure over the maximum future registration period (5 years)
- G-3 Copies of audited financial statements for the last two financial years.
- G-4 A brief history of the entity including the year when operations commenced, and any major changes in corporate structure, acquisitions, disposals, etc.
- G-5 The corporate family tree, outlining the immediate and ultimate parent, subsidiaries, and other related entities.
- G-6 Projected sales revenue and pre-tax profit figures for the current financial year ending 30 June 2017.
- G-7 Details of business strategies relating to corporate activity, business restructuring, trading activity, new opportunities, and risk management.
- G-8 For each type of funding facility in place (eg overdraft, bank guarantees, loans and surety bonds) provide:
 - Name of provider
 - Type of facility (e.g. overdraft, bank guarantees, etc)
 - Limit of facility
 - Amount utilised
 - Maturity date
 - Covenants (financial, operating, reporting, etc)
 - This should be provided in the form of a letter from entity's financier.
- G-9 A statement providing details of the entities compliance with its banking covenants in the past 3 years. For any breaches provide details including date, reason for the breach and remedial action taken.





Background

- 1. As Minister, you are responsible under the *Education Act 2004* (the Act) for determining applications for registration renewal and registration at additional educational levels of ACT non-government schools.
- 2. When determining an application for registration renewal and/or registration at additional education levels the Act requires you to:
 - a. appoint a panel to report to you on the application; and
 - b. consider the panel's report on whether the school meets the criteria for registration renewal and/or registration at additional education levels.
- Page 1 of <u>Attachment A</u> states the criteria for registration as it applies to applications for registration renewal.
- 4. The Director responsible for the registration of non-government schools is delegated to appoint the panels that report to you on applications for registration. This Director is also the Registrar.
- 5. Due to OSS's request for a partial registration process against the previous panel's concerns a smaller than usual panel was convened to report to you. This panel was chaired by a principal of an ACT public school and included:
 - an officer from the Directorate's Strategic Finance Branch who facilitates an assessment of the school's financial viability; and
 - an officer of Office of the Board of Senior Secondary Studies (BSSS).
- 6. If after considering a panel's report you are satisfied that a school meets the relevant criteria for registration the Act requires you to direct the Registrar to renew the school's registration for a stated period of no longer than five years.

Issues

- The registration panel appointed to report to you on the OSS's application found the school to be:
 - a. compliant with the financial viability criterion;
 - compliant with BSSS mandatory subject hour requirements if the school's proposed restructured timetable is implemented in 2019. (<u>Attachment E</u>).

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6. The Directorate recommends registration for 1 January 2019 – 31 December 2021 (which is the registration period requested by the school) contingent on the Directorate receiving evidence that the school is implementing the BSSS endorsed and restructured timetable before the commencement of classes in 2019.

- 11. The OSS principal has undertaken to implement the timetable assessed by BSSS in 2019, and to provide evidence to the Directorate in January 2019.
- 12. Corporate Scorecard, an accredited and independent financial viability assessor, was engaged by the Directorate to assess the financial viability of all independent schools seeking registration renewal in 2018. Corporate Scorecard's advanced financial assessment (<u>Attachment D2</u>) found OSS to be financially viable.

Benefits/Sensitivities

- 13. The recommended registration renewal of OSS will permit the school to operate from 2019 to 2021.
- 14. Making the registration renewal contingent on the provision of evidence of full compliance with the BSSS mandatory study hours is consistent with the approach taken by the Directorate when

were found to be non-compliant with BSSS mandatory hours of study.

I am writing to you about the Non-Government School Infrastructure Upgrades Program.

During the 2016 ACT Election I committed as ACT Labor education spokesperson to allocating infrastructure grant funding of \$15 million over four years for non-government schools. I am happy to advise that access to this funding will begin from 2019. The ACT Block Grant Authority (ACTBGA) has been engaged by the ACT Government to administer the Program, and the ACTBGA will assess applications to the program against a number of criteria.

While the Program aims to enable non-government schools to improve their infrastructure for the benefit of all students, in keeping with the government's election commitment the eligibility criteria specifically adopt an equitable, needs-based approach. It includes criteria related to the capacity of a school to self-fund projects and consideration of projects focused on accessibility to disadvantaged groups, including students from low socio-economic status backgrounds, students with a disability, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students, and students with a low-level of English language proficiency.

Complete and accurate applications for this program close at 12 pm on Wednesday 13 February 2019 for the 2019 round of grants. The ACTBGA will review, assess and prioritise applications received and by May 2019 will submit proposed grant approvals to the ACT Government. I intend to consider proposed grant approvals by June 2019 so that these grants can be paid to successful applicants in July 2019.

I write to inform you of extremely disappointing actions repeatedly taken by school (Orana Steiner School) during term one 2019, where absent registered teachers were replaced with teacher aids rather than registered teachers. These repeated actions put the school children at severe risk.

These actions (and the subsequent views expressed by the - see Attachment A) contravene, and show an irresponsible disregard to, the conditions of school registration and teacher registration in the Australian Capital Territory.

In regard to **school registration**, the actions (and views expressed) contravene the conditions of registration outlined in section 91 of the *Education Act (ACT) 2004* with the most obvious contraventions being of the following two provisions:

(b) the school has appropriate policies, facilities and equipment for – (i) the curriculum offered by the school; and (ii) the safety and welfare of its students;

(e) the teaching staff are qualified to teach at the educational levels at which they are employed to teach

Further, in regard to **teacher registration**, the actions contravene the *ACT Teachers Quality Institute Act 2010*. Specifically, the actions contravene section 29:

29 Offence — employing, engaging or allowing a person who is not an approved teacher to teach in school
(1) A person commits an offence if —

(a) the person employs, engages or allows another person to teach in a school; and
(b) the other person is not an approved teacher.
Maximum penalty 50 penalty units.

(2) An offence against this section is a strict liability offence.

I request that you take immediate appropriate actions regarding this matter, including that you direct or recommend:

- 1. the Education Directorate (or relevant body) to investigate Orana Steiner School to find whether it actually meets all of the conditions of School Registration under the *Education Act (ACT) 2004*; and
- 2. the Teacher Quality Institute to investigate and prosecute teacher contraventions of the *ACT Teacher Quality Institute Act 2010* at the Orana Steiner School during term one 2019.

Here we have a situation where the school has repeatedly made the deliberate decision to not supply a registered teacher – and then when questioned about it has tried to defend that decision of not supplying our children with such basic care owed to them. It is disgraceful and grossly negligent.

Please note that the quality of teaching by the regular class teacher and assistant is excellent. The decision to require the teacher's assistant to relieve when the class teacher was absent was made by the

and I am concerned about continued role in after failing to display the requisite professional judgement required to ensure the school is operating within its legal framework to ensure the safety and welfare of the students.

Please see my correspondence with Orana about this at **Attachment A**. While my correspondence is in regard to specifically, the full extent of this – and other – failure/s of the operation of the School may potentially be much broader.

This is a very expensive school and I am really concerned about how it has been allowed to get to this state under ACT Government legislation to the point where even the leadership team do not even understand – or choose to disregard – basic teaching principles like duty of care. I think it may be worth undertaking a full audit/review.

Authorised person investigation into Orana Steiner School's compliance with a condition of registration

Dear

As you would be aware ACT non-government schools are required to operate in accordance with the conditions of registration detailed in the *Education Act 2004* (the Act). Section 91(e) of the Act requires non-government schools to ensure teaching staff are qualified to teach at the educational levels at which they are employed to teach.

It has come to my attention that Orana Steiner School may have contravened a condition of registration by allowing a teachers-aid (who did not hold teaching qualifications or Teacher Quality Institute registration) to conduct a class at your school on at least one occasion in 2019.

Under section 122 of the Act, an authorised person may enter a non-government school at any time when it is being used as a school under the Act to find out whether the school is complying with the Act. Although under section 124 of the Act you are not required to consent to this entry, the authorised person will ask for your consent, and will ask you to sign an acknowledgment of the consent.

I have asked Ms Lynda Tooth Director, Non-government Education within the Education Directorate, and a person authorised under section 119 of the Act, to enter Orana Steiner School and investigate the school's employment records and staff qualifications relating to all classes taught during 2019.

Ms Tooth will contact you next week to advise you of the time of her visit to your school. I ask you to provide her with every assistance in her investigation.

If in preparing for this visit you identify that the school has contravened this condition of registration or if there are other facts that you think need to be brought to our attention I encourage you to provide to Ms Tooth a written statement. This statement may outline the facts of this matter and may include how you will ensure future compliance with the condition of registration.

11. The principal indicated was unaware that the practice of using unqualified teachers aids to run classes when teachers were away, was more significant than initially advised earlier in my meeting. I have no reason to doubt the sincerity of assertions.

Finding

- 12. Non-compliance with condition E was confirmed on seven occasions in term 1 2019.
- 13. The principal took remedial action to ensure this does not happen again.
- 14. If the new arrangements are consistently implemented these new arrangements will the school is unlikely to be non-compliant with the Condition E again (See item 3 above).
- 15. Of the 32 teaching staff absences in term 2 2019 (Term 2 started 29 April 2019) all teaching staff were replaced by teaching staff. This suggest that the new relief staffing arrangements had been implemented.
- 16. No further action is deemed necessary.





- 4. Under Sn 95 of the Act contravention of a condition of registration is grounds for the cancellation of a non-government school's registration.
- 5. You were briefed on this matter on 31 May 2019 (MIN19/596).
- 6. In June 2019 the Registrar of non-government schools instructed an authorised person, to enter the school under Sn 122 of the Act and investigate the school's employment practices and inspect the school's employment records and staff qualifications.

Issues

- 7. The authorised person found that on seven occasions in term 1 2019 OSS deployed a teacher's aide who did not have teaching qualifications or Teacher Quality Institute (TQI) registration to act as relief staff in charge of OSS classrooms during periods when teachers were ill, and the school could not source Steiner trained relief teaching staff.







Background

- 1. Orana Steiner School (Orana) comprises:
 - a. a registered ACT non-government school (NGS) for kindergarten year 12; and
 - b. Orana Early Childhood Centre and Kindergarten is also an approved service under the *Education and Care Services National Law (ACT) Act 2011* (the National Law).

Orana Steiner School (OSS)

- 2. The Education Directorate has responsibility for:
 - a. registering ACT NGS;
 - b. inspecting ACT NGS for compliance with the conditions of registration and the Act;
 - c. managing the panel processes that report to the Minister on applications for registration or registration renewal; and
 - d. regulating providers of early childhood education against the National Law.
- 3. As a condition of registration (S. 91 of the *Education Act* 2004 (the Act)) ACT NGS must have appropriate policies for the safety and welfare of students. The Act does not stipulate what policies or procedures a NGS must have.
- 4. Under S. 94 of the Act the proprietor of a non-government school must develop and implement a complaints policy for the school, and as soon as practical investigate any complaint about the administration, management and operation of the school that is not frivolous or vexatious.
- 5. As part of the school's last full kindergarten year 12 registration renewal process (in 2016), the panel stated that it was satisfied that the school had appropriate policies, facilities and equipment for the safety and welfare of its students, and that its policies and practices referenced the National Safe Schools Framework.
- 6. In 2018 an OSS student was removed from the school by the child's mother and the Education Directorate asked the school to provide evidence that it was meeting the condition of registration that requires NGS's to have policies for the safety and welfare of students. Orana provided evidence that it had the following policies for the safety and welfare of students including:
 - a. Working with Vulnerable People Policy
 - b. Reportable Conduct Policy
 - c. Mandatory Reporting Policy
 - d. Critical Incidents (Emergency Response) Policy

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7. In June 2019 the Education Directorate undertook an Authorised Person inspection of Orana relating to allegations that the school was contravening a condition of registration relating to the school utilising teacher's aides as relief teachers. As the school admitted it had been undertaking the practice and revised its relief staffing guidelines; no further action was deemed necessary. You were advised of the outcome of the inspection in Min19/596.

Orana Early Childhood Centre and Kindergarten

- 8. Children's Education and Care Assurance (CECA) within the Education Directorate are the Regulatory Authority under the National Law for the ACT.
- 9. Orana Early Childhood Centre and Kindergarten's current risk rating is 'High (4)'. This rating is largely due to the service receiving a Working Towards quality rating in 2018 and having compliance action taken in March 2019. On 1 August 2019 an audit was conducted where only minor compliance issues were identified. The next Assessment and Rating is scheduled for August 2020.
- The National Law requires services to have a complaints policy (Regulation 168(2)(o)), and for services to notify CECA if they receive a complaint alleging that the National Law has been contravened (Section 174(2)).
- 11. CECA assesses complaints and, where appropriate, conducts investigations to determine if an offence has occurred. If a breach of the National Law is confirmed, appropriate compliance action can be taken.

<u>Complaint</u>

- 12. On 16 December 2019 wrote to you urging you to review the school's ongoing suitability to remain registered.
- 13. alleged that had been aware of instances of probable student harm at the school over the last 18 months.

Issues

- 14. alleges that:
 - a. During 2018

raised this matter with the school principal and was not satisfied that the principal had provided "a sense of confidence" that the school would manage this situation.

b. During 2019

became the subject of concern for parents, and out of students left the school.

c. At an undetermined time, a person entered the school grounds and a child felt unsafe.

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- 15. The Senior Director non-government Education (NGE) has contacted and suggested raise concerns with the proprietor of the school (as per S. 94 of the Act). indicated would be happy to do this in the first instance and would contact the Directorate if was not satisfied with the proprietor's response.
- 16. The Registrar of NGSs could consider investigating these allegations if the school's proprietor does not meet its obligations under S. 94 of the Act.





Background

- 1. The *Education Act 2004* (the Act) requires you as Minister to appoint a panel to report to you on non-government school registration applications.
- In November 2013 the then Minister for Education and Training delegated² the appointment of registration panels for non-government schools to the Deputy Director-General (E451) and Registrar of Non-government Schools (E607). In May 2021 you appointed position number E825 as the new Registrar of non-government schools (FILE2021/230³).
- 3. Section 227 of the *Legislation Act 2001* excludes Assembly consultation for the appointment of these panels because the role of the panel is to advise you in the exercise of your function under the Act.

Registration renewal for 2021

4. The Education Directorate has received applications for registration renewal from the proprietors of six Catholic systemic and seven independent schools. The registrations of all 13 schools expire on 31 December 2021. These schools are:

 Although the registration renewal processes for independent schools will continue to be managed by the Education Directorate; the Directorate proposes to streamline the processes for 2021.

Issues

Ministerial Delegations

- 7. It is recommended that the ministerial delegations be updated to reflect the correct position numbers following the recent change in appointment of Registrar of non-government schools and the relevant supervising Deputy Director General.
- 8. With this agreement, the Directorate will appoint the panels described below to advise you on non-government school registration applications. The decision to renew registration will remain solely with you in your statutory function.

Independent school registration renewal panels

- 12. The Education Directorate recommends appointing a single panel to report to you on the seven applications made by independent schools for registration renewal. This is instead of appointing seven panels to report separately to you on these applications.
- 13. The panel will focus on each school's compliance with the conditions of registration (as in previous years) but utilise streamlined evidence of compliance in the form of extended statements of assurance and compliance as the basis of their deliberations.
- 14. The Directorate proposes that the panel will:
 - a. be chaired by an independent and well-regarded educational leader who is remunerated at a rate commensurate with other professional panels appointed to provide expert advice;
 - b. include two independent school principals as nominated by the Association of Independent Schools ACT and a Government School Principal nominated by the Director General or delegate; and
 - c. be appointed using updated delegations for the appointment of nongovernment school panels.
- 15. Should any principal appointee be unable to attend a scheduled meeting, the Directorate proposes that the panel chair will approve a written proxy from the same or another school in the relevant sector, for that instance.
- 16. The Directorate proposes to provide the panel chair with:
 - a. the report templates used in 2020 for the purposes of determining how best to report to you on registration applications;
 - b. the completed 2020 reports for the two schools which were renewed for 2021 only due to limited financial viability;
 - c. a risk profile for each applicant school which summarises each school's previous registration application outcomes, current enrolment trends, and school leadership;
 - d. a summary of any issues raised about the school with the Directorate;
 - e. the financial viability summary (as based on independent assessments by Corporate Scorecard) as cleared by the Directorate's Chief Financial Officer;
 - f. the Board of Senior Secondary Studies (BSSS) compliance assessment for schools offering the ACT Year 12 certificate;
 - g. a copy of all other information provided by the school as evidence of compliance with the conditions of registration;
 - a copy of all other information provided by the school as evidence of processes undertaken by the school to ensure ongoing compliance with the conditions of registration; and

- i. any other information requested by the panel chair, in deliberation with the panel, for the purposes of the panel's consideration.
- 17. The chair and panel members will be asked to sign relevant documents to fulfill their role, including a document that sets out the statutory role and criteria informing their reports. The intent of this document is to ensure the panel remains focussed on the criteria.
- 18. The Directorate proposes that the single panel appointed to report to you on the seven applications made by independent schools for registration renewal be chaired by

- 30. The process also aims to avoid conduct observed by Directorate officers, the AIS and independent schools, that panels have ventured into the realms of policy and preferences beyond the statutory criteria.
- 31. The proposed 2021 process aims to improve the confidence of the community and independent schools in the objectivity of registration renewal.





The ACT Block Grant Authority (ACTBGA) thanks the Australian Capital Territory Education Directorate for appointing the ACTBGA to provide the service of delivering the Better Schools for Our Kids: Non-Government School Infrastructure Upgrades Program (BSK).

This letter sets out the determination of the ACTBGA Board regarding projects to be funded in round 4 of the BSK program for the 2022 funding year.

Assessment Process

On 2 June 2021, the ACTBGA called for applications from its participants for the 2022 round. Applications closed on 3 August 2021 and six applications were received.

The BSK Assessment Committee ('the Committee') consists of eight members; with the ACTBGA Board Chair presiding, along with four appointees from Association of Independent Schools of the ACT (AIS) and four appointees from Catholic Education Canberra and Goulburn (CE), as shown in the table below:

The Committee met four times from 23 September to 11 November 2021. All members of the Committee were invited to attend each school visit via video conference, accompanied virtually by the ACTBGA Board Chair and ACTBGA Executive Officer, on 28 September and 1 October 2021.

One Assessment Committee member declared a partial conflict of interest, which was managed in accordance with the ACTBGA's Conflicts of Interest Policy. It is noted that removing the member's priority ranking scores from the collective Committee rankings resulted in all project rankings remaining the same.

Committee members were required to rank projects across five criteria, scoring from 1 to 6 (with 1 being the lowest priority rank and 6 the highest priority), taking into account how great the need for the project is and how well the project would meet this need.

A number of changes to the assessment criteria and ranking were proposed in this round; in particular, inclusion and exclusion of specific assessment criteria to better align with the ACT Government Services Agreement, and introduction of weighting of all assessment criteria. These changes were discussed with the ACTBGA Board at its August 2021 meeting, with the Committee at its initial two meetings, and ultimately agreed to by the Committee at its second and third meetings.

The agreed assessment criteria for the Committee to consider their project rankings and the accepted weighting applied was as follows:

- 20% Project provides accessibility of services to disadvantaged groups (incl. low socioeconomic status backgrounds, disability, Indigenous and a low-level of English language proficiency).
- 2. 23% Project increases enrolment capacity.
- 3. 23% Project provides best value for money and contributes to maximisation of funding outcomes.
- 4. 11% Readiness of the school to commence construction (project proposal provides confidence in the school's project planning process and ability to meet proposed timelines).
- 5. 23% Project improves the amenity of the non-government school in respect of compliance of facilities with government requirements and supporting advances in school pedagogy.

Finance Subcommittee members and , along with independent Finance Subcommittee Chair, , met three times with the Executive Officer via video conference between 21 September to 29 October 2021, to bring recommendations to the Committee on the financial viability and financial need of each applicant school.

Application Summaries

A summary of each application is provided below.

Ranked 5th: Orana Steiner School

This project is for the construction of a music block and refurbishment of some existing music teaching spaces to accommodate music practice, music performance, teacher workspaces and storage of musical instruments.

The proposed new building will consist of three small music practice rooms and one larger group practice room with adjacent storage, along with a rehearsal room for ensemble classes and staff office space. The project also encompasses strategic refurbishment of existing school facilities to co-locate the music program and provide connectivity and shelter (by means of a new covered walkway) between music spaces. This reconfiguration/restructure addresses current difficulties with acoustic separation between music and other facilities on campus. The project also includes the removal of existing demountables on site as well as a temporary fit-out of decommissioned art demountables for temporary use during construction.

The project caters to all students across the K-12 school and is needed to replace very old and inadequate demountables, increase the overall number of spaces for music teaching and performance, and renew existing spaces. Additionally, the school reported its current music facilities are no longer suitable in that they do not allow for compliance with supervision requirements.

While the project does not specifically increase enrolments, the Committee considered there was a high need for this project to address the condition and suitability of the school's existing facilities. The Committee agreed that the project is well planned, offers value for money and also sustainability through the refurbishment of existing facilities. It was considered the project allows for improved delivery of the school's curriculum in accordance with its Steiner philosophy, which places a high emphasis on music.

The total project cost is \$1,332,673. The grant sought is \$1,000,000. The school has demonstrated that it is viable and has low forecasted debt per student. It has high cash reserves that are anticipated to reduce over 2022 due to other planned capital works, and the school is intending to borrow to meet its contribution to this project. Based on its forecast cashflow, the Finance Subcommittee considered the school has additional borrowing capacity. The Committee's recommendation for funding towards this project was \$800,000.

ACTBGA Board Determination

On 23 November 2021, the ACTBGA Board made the following determinations:

- 1. The ACTBGA Board approved five projects to be funded in the Better Schools for Our Kids 2022 round, as follows:
 - \$500,000 Emmaus Christian School
 - \$1,000,000 St Matthew's Primary School
 - \$450,000 Blue Gum Community School
 - \$1,000,000 Islamic School of Canberra
 - \$800,000 Orana Steiner School

The ACT Government will give five ACT non-government schools almost \$4 million this year to undertake infrastructure upgrades to improve access for disadvantaged groups and cater for students with additional needs.



Non-government school registrations

During the fourth quarter of 2021:

- there were no changes to the number of non-government schools registered to operate in the ACT; and
- the 2021 registration renewal processes for seven independent and six Catholic systemic schools were finalised (as detailed below).

As a result of the 2021 registration renewal processes (which used for the first time an independent remunerated panel chair to develop a report to the Minister on the seven independent school applications for registration renewal) the Minister directed the Registrar of Non-government Schools (FILE2021/5599) to:

1. renew the registration of following independent schools for five years:

• the independent school panel reporting on seven (7) schools



- Strategic Finance Branch who facilitated financial viability reports undertaken by *Corporate* Scorecard on the seven (7) applicant independent schools and
- the Office of the Board of Senior Secondary Studies who reviewed the compliance with the BSSS
 requirements of four (4) schools and worked with these where required schools to rectify any
 identified concerns. The Office of the BSSS was able to provide reports indicating satisfactory
 compliance to the relevant panels of the following schools:

Dear

Following the release in 2018 of Future of Education: An ACT Education Strategy for the Next Ten Years (the Future of Education Strategy), the Education Directorate has been consulting with non-government school stakeholders with a view to strengthening equity, student agency, access and inclusion for students in ACT schools and amending legislation relating to the registration and operations of ACT Non-government schools.

On 8 June 2022, the ACT Legislative Assembly passed amendments to the *Education Act 2004* (the Act) and Education Regulations 2005 (the Regulations) through the *Education Amendment Bill 2022* (the Bill). Amendments in the Bill impact both government and non-government schools in the ACT.

A copy of the Amendment Bill can be found on the Legislation Register at: <u>https://www.legislation.act.gov.au/b/db_65838/</u>, and a comprehensive overview of the changes is contained within the Explanatory Statements.

Amendments that impact all ACT schools

Suspensions, transfers, expulsions, and exclusions

Following the release of the Interim Report of the Royal Commission into Violence, Abuse, Neglect and Exploitation of People with Disability, sections in the Act relating to suspensions, transfers and exclusions were reviewed to provide clarity for when and why schools can undertake these actions and to also provide safeguards for students, including students with disability.

From 20 December 2022, updated provisions will come into effect that relate to:

- suspensions (both government and non-government schools) (Part 2A.2);
- transfers (government schools only) (Part 2A.3);
- expulsions (non-government schools only) (Part 2A.4); and
- exclusions (government and Catholic system schools only) (Part 2A.5).

Amendments made through the Bill include articulating 'unsafe or noncompliant behaviour' as the rationale for enacting a suspension, transfer, expulsion or exclusion (section 17B); the requirement to exhaust all reasonable alternatives before making a decision to suspend, transfer, expel or exclude (section 17D); and requirements for communicating with parents and students (section 17E).

Student Movement Register

Following the *Coronial Inquest into the death of Bradyn Stuart Dillon*, it has been identified that student connection with the education system is one way to mitigate the risks associated with multiple movements between schools within a short period of time for vulnerable students and their families.

From 20 December 2022, under new sections 10AA and 10AB all transfers, expulsions, exclusions, unenrolments and contract terminations will be required to be reported through the new Student Movement Register (previously known as the Student Transfer Register) within five days of occurrence.

Amendments to the Regulations (new section 2AA) outlines the information prescribed to be entered into the Student Movement Register.

Oversight and monitoring of the Student Movement Register will be the responsibility of the Education Directorate, including following up students of compulsory education age who have not re-enrolled at a new school or education provider, or registered for home education. This is to ensure all children and young people in the ACT are connected with schools or are registered for home education, and the protective factors that this connection brings.

Amendments that impact ACT non-government schools

As you are aware before a non-government school in the ACT can commence its operations it must receive in-principle approval to apply for provisional registration and at least 12 months later apply for registration. Once registered the school must seek registration renewal every five years and before it can expand its operations (through an additional campus or additional educational levels) it must receive additional in-principle approval in order to apply for registration of the changed operations.

The ACT Government recognises that the multiple steps required to establish or expand a school, and then renew its registration creates an administrative burden for non-government schools and detracts from your core business — educating children and young people.

A reduction in registration steps

From 20 December 2022 the following registration steps will no longer be required:

- provisional registration for beginning schools
- in-principle approval in order to apply for registration of an established school at an additional campus or additional educational levels; and
- registration renewal.

This means that all ACT non-government schools who are registered as at 19 December 2022 will transition automatically to ongoing registration.

New regulatory framework

Following a comprehensive update to Chapter 4 of the Act, a new regulatory framework has been developed in consultation with key stakeholders, including the Association of Independent Schools of the ACT (AIS), Catholic Education, Canberra and Goulburn (CECG), the Independent Education Union and the Association of Parents and Friends of ACT Schools Inc.

From 20 December 2022, Non-government School Registration Standards (the Registration Standards) will replace the conditions of registration as stated in s91 of the Act. The Registration Standards cover four key areas of governance, educational courses and educational programs, safety and welfare, and other operational requirements.

To oversee the Registration Standards and the regulatory framework which will support the standards, a Registration Standards Advisory Board (the Board) will be appointed. Appointed members of the Board will have appropriate experience and expertise to provide advice on matters relating to the Registration Standards. Day-to-day administrative functions related to registration will remain with the Education Directorate, through the Registrar of non-government schools.

Before the end of each calendar year, the Registrar, in consultation with the Board, will prepare a program for registration reviews for the next calendar year. The program for the reviews will outline the registered schools to be reviewed during the year and the areas of focus for registration reviews. In addition to a program of risk-based reviews, reviews can also be conducted after a concern is raised about a school's compliance with the Act.

Registration Standards Guidelines and *Registration Review Guidelines* will be developed in collaboration with the Registration Standards Advisory Board and non-government schools. These guidelines will outline how schools can demonstrate they are meeting the registration standards, as well as how registration reviews and subsequent actions will be implemented.

These amendments aim to reduce the administrative burden associated with multiple registration and renewal steps; and provide the community with confidence that a strong set of Registration Standards and the advice of a Board comprised of members with appropriate experience and expertise support the education provided by the ACT non-government school sector.

Support for ACT non-government schools

We will be supporting your move to the new regulatory model by:

- providing you with a paper that provides a comprehensive overview of the changes to the Act and their associated impacts; and
- inviting you to join small group online briefing sessions in:
