Government School Bulletin

February 2000 Census

Overview

On 16 February 2000 the ACT Government Census was conducted. The Census indicated that a total of 38,754 students attended 95¹ schools. This represents a decrease of 428 students, or 1.1% since February 1999.

Government schools

A total of 21,197 students attended 69¹ ACT government primary schools. This represents a decrease of 149 students, or 0.7% since February 1999.

A total of 10,465 students attended 17¹ government high schools. This represents a decrease of 125 students, or 1.2%, since February 1999.

A total of 6,790 students attended 8 government secondary colleges. This represents an decrease of 136 students, or 2.0 % since February 1999.

A total of 302 students attended 4 government special schools. This represents a decrease of 18 students, or 5.6%, from February 1999.

Explanatory Notes

1. Reference Date

The census was conducted on Wednesday, 16 February 2000.

2. Scope and Coverage

The census includes all ACT government schools providing primary, secondary and special education.

3. Collection

ACT government schools census data was electronically downloaded.

4. Student Enrolments

The census includes students enrolled in a government school on census day.

5. Special Schools

Special schools cater for students with intellectual and physical disabilities, or who are emotionally and/or behaviourally disturbed.

6. Special Classes

Hearing Impaired Units (HIU)

HIUs are for students with a significant hearing impairment who require substantial additional support.

Introductory English Centres (IEC)

IECs are for students who require intensive full time English language instruction.

Learning Support Centre (LSC)

LSCs are for students in primary and high schools who are identified as having serious difficulties in achieving expected educational outcomes.

Learning Support Unit (LSU)

LSUs are for primary aged students who are assessed as needing special support. These classes are located in mainstream primary schools and provide for increased levels of integration and appropriate academic programs.

ACT GOVERNMENT SCHOOLS, FEBRUARY 2000


