Government School Bulletin

August 2005 Census

Overview

On 5 August 2005 the ACT Government Schools Census was conducted. The Census indicated that a total of 35,496 students attended 96^1 schools. This represents a decrease of 459 students, or 1.3%, since August 2004.

A total of 19,288 students attended 70^1 government primary schools. This represents a decrease of 417 students, or 2.1%, since August 2004.

A total of 10,278 students attended 18^1 government high schools. This represents a decrease of 23 students, or 0.2%, since August 2004.

A total of 5,582 students attended 8 government secondary colleges. This represents a decrease of 37 students, or 0.7%, since August 2004.

A total of 348 students attended 4 government special schools. This represents an increase of 18 students, or 5.5%, since August 2004.

¹ This includes four schools that have both primary and high school students.

2. **Scope and Coverage**

The census includes all ACT government schools providing primary, secondary and special education.

3. Collection

ACT government schools census data was electronically downloaded.

4. **Student Enrolments**

The census includes students enrolled in a government school on census day.

5. **Special Schools**

Special schools cater for students with intellectual and physical disabilities, or who are emotionally and/or behaviourally disturbed.

6. **Introductory English Centres (IEC)**


IECs are for students who require intensive full time English language instruction.

In August 2005

Total primary school enrolments were 19,288. This includes 1,634 primary school students enrolled at combined primary/high schools. (In August 2004, the figures were 19,705 (including Jervis Bay) and 1,318 respectively.) Total high school enrolments were 10,278. This includes 1,772 high school students enrolled at combined primary/high schools. (In August 2004, the figures were 10,301 and 1,724 respectively.) The four combined schools are Telopea Park School, Gold Creek School, Wanniassa School and Amaroo School. Note: The ACT Department of Education and Training administers Jervis Bay School for the Australian Government under a service agreement.
