Government School Bulletin

August 2002 Census

Overview

On 31 July 2002 the ACT Government Schools Census was conducted. The Census indicated that a total of 37,352 students attended 95¹ schools. This represents a decrease of 695 students, or 1.83%, since August 2001.

A total of 20,817 students attended 69¹ ACT government primary schools. This represents a decrease of 536 students, or 2.51%, since August 2001.

A total of 10,285 students attended 17¹ government high schools. This represents a decrease of 46 students, or 0.45%, since August 2001.

A total of 5,951 students attended 8 government secondary colleges. This represents a decrease of 118 students, or 1.94%, since August 2001.

A total of 299 students attended 4 government special schools. This represents an increase of 5 student, or 1.70%, since August 2001.

ACT government schools census data was electronically downloaded.

4. Student Enrolments

The census includes students enrolled in a government school on census day.

5. Special Schools

Special schools cater for students with intellectual and physical disabilities, or who are emotionally and/or behaviourally disturbed.


6. Introductory English Centres (IEC)

In February 2002

Total primary school enrolments were 20,817. This includes 1,449 primary school students enrolled at combined primary/high schools. (In August 2001, the figures were 19,945 (including Jervis Bay) and 1,408 respectively.)

Total high school enrolments were 10,285. This includes 1,675 high school students enrolled at combined primary/high schools. (In August 2001, the figures were 8,695 and 1,636 respectively.)

The three combined schools are Telopea Park School, Gold Creek School and the Wanniassa School.

Note: The ACT Department of Education, Youth and Family Services administers Jervis Bay Primary School for the Commonwealth under a service agreement.
