

ACT PUBLIC SCHOOL CENSUS

August 2008

This publication provides information on students enrolled in ACT public schools as at 1 August 2008.

Key Findings

In August 2008 there were 38 025 students attending the 84 ACT public schools, a decrease of 328 students or 0.9% from August 2007.

There were 22 372 students (58.8% of all public school students) attending a public primary school, down 22 students or 0.1% since August 2007.

Within the primary school sector the number of students at the preschool level has increased by 261 students (7.1%) since August 2007.

In August 2008 there were 9809 students (25.8% of all public school students) attending a public high school at the high school level, down 197 students or 2.0% since August 2007.

There were 5501 students (14.5% of all public school students) attending a public college, a decrease of 105 students or 1.9% from August 2007.

In August 2008 there were 1919 public school students accessing special education programs. This is an increase of 3.8% since August 2007.

















Introduction

This publication presents the results from the ACT public school census conducted on Friday 1 August 2008. Unlike the February ACT school census, the August census conducted by the Department covers public school students only.

In 2008, the ACT Government made a policy decision to amalgamate public preschools with public primary schools, thus creating P-6 primary schools. Consequently, the results provided in this census publication for ACT public primary schools include preschool students, and a separate preschool census publication will no longer be prepared.

Student enrolments 2004 to 2008

In August 2008 there were 38 025 students enrolled in ACT public schools, down 0.9% or 328 students on August 2007 (Table 1). Each of the four sectors, primary, high, college and special, all showed a decline in 2008 over 2007, with the largest decline both in terms of numbers and percentages occurring in the high school sector, down 197 students (-2.0%).

Over half of all public school students (58.8%) attended a public primary school in 2008. This is virtually unchanged from 2004 (58.9%). High schools accounted for another 25.8% of students in 2008, compared with 26.0% in 2004. College students accounted for 14.5% of the total student population in 2008, up 0.3 percentage points from 14.2% in 2004.

Since 2004 the number of public school students identifying as being of Indigenous origin has increased by 3.8% to 1046 students (Table 2). This increase is mainly due to an increase of 45 Indigenous students (6.7%) in primary schools.

Since 2004 the number of public school students with special needs has increased by 7.8% to 1919 students (Table 3). The majority of this increase can be attributed to the primary and high school sectors, with an increase of 73 students (7.1%) and 60 students (19.2%) respectively with special needs.

Table 4 shows the numbers of males and females across the various levels of schooling from 2004 to 2008. There are slightly more males than females in ACT public schools (51.2% in 2008) although at the college level there was generally a lower proportion of males than in primary and high schools.

Explanatory Notes

Reference date

The 2008 August public school census was conducted on Friday 1 August.

Scope and coverage

The August School Census includes students at all ACT public schools providing primary, secondary and special education. The 2008 publication also includes students in public preschools, which were amalgamated with a public primary school in 2008. Jervis Bay is included in ACT public primary schools as the ACT Department of Education and Training administers the Jervis Bay School for the Australian Government under a service agreement.

Collection

ACT public school census data was electronically downloaded from the Department's centralised administrative system.

Student enrolments

The census includes students enrolled in a school on census day.

Introductory English Centres (IECs)

IECs are for students who require intensive full time English language instruction.

Mature students

Students in public schools aged 20 years or over on 31 January in the year of commencement of their college studies are classed as Mature.

Older students

Students in public schools aged 18 years by 31 December in the year prior to the commencement of their college studies, but not aged 20 years or over on 31 January in the year of commencement of their college studies, are classed as Older.

Primary school sector

The primary school sector includes students from preschool to year 6.

High school sector

High schools include those students in years 7, 8, 9 and 10.

College sector

The college sector includes those students in years 11 and 12 as well as those students defined as mature and older.

Special schools

Special schools cater for students with a disability who require intensive levels of support for intellectual and physical disabilities, or who require additional emotional and/or behavioural assistance.
