ACT Government School Census

August 2007

Highlights

In August 2007 there were:

- 34 705 students attending 88 government schools
- 18 746 students attending a primary school, representing 54.0% of all government school students
- 10 006 students attending a high school, representing 28.8% of all government school students
- 5606 students attending secondary colleges, representing 16.2% of all government school students
- 347 students attending a special school, representing 1.0% of all government school students
- 1767 students accessing special education programs
- increases of 60 primary school students and 8 high school students from the February 2007 census.

Government student enrolments

There were 34 705 students attending 88 government schools as at 3 August 2007, representing a decrease of 473 enrolments or 1.3% since August 2006 (Table 1). The overall decrease comprises of a decrease of 345 (1.8%) in government primary school enrolments, a decrease of 118 (1.2%) in government high school enrolments and a decrease of 26 (0.5%) in government college enrolments. The decrease was partly offset by an increase of 16 or 4.8% in government special school enrolments.

Since 2003 the number of students attending a government school has decreased by 2034 enrolments or 5.5%. The overall reduction comprises a decrease of 1466 (7.3%) in government primary school enrolments, a decrease of 320 (3.1%) in government high school enrolments, a decrease of 268 (4.6%) in government college enrolments. The decrease was partly offset by an increase of 20 (6.1%) in government special school enrolments.

While the above shows a decrease in enrolments in the majority of government school sectors between August 2006 and August 2007, there has been an increase in the majority of sectors since the February census of 2007. Enrolments have increased in the government primary school sector by 60 enrolments, the government high school sector by 8 enrolments, and the government special school sector by 9 enrolments. The government college sector has dropped by 392 enrolments, which closely resembles past year trends and reflects a number of college students completing their college studies before the end of the calendar year and/or taking up full time employment or an apprenticeship.

Figure 1: Number of government students by sector, August 2007 and February 2007



Explanatory Notes

1. Reference Date

The August 2007 government school census was conducted on Friday August 3 2007.

2. Scope and Coverage

The August census includes all ACT government schools. Jervis Bay School is included as the ACT Department of Education and Training administers the school for the Australian Government under a service agreement.

3. Collection

ACT government school census data was electronically downloaded.

4. Student Enrolments

The census includes students enrolled in a school on census day.

5. Special Schools

Special schools cater for students who require intensive levels of support for intellectual and physical disabilities, or who require additional emotional and/or behavioral assistance.

6. Introductory English Centres (IECs)

IECs are for students who require intensive full time English language instruction.

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
