Government School Bulletin

August 2004 Census

## Overview

On 6 August 2004 the ACT Government Schools Census was conducted. The Census indicated that a total of 35,955 students attended $96^{1}$ schools. This represents a decrease of 784 students, or $2.1 \%$, since August 2003.

A total of 19,705 students attended $70^{1}$ government primary schools. This represents a decrease of 507 students, or $2.5 \%$, since August 2003.

A total of 10,301 students attended $17^{1}$ government high schools. This represents a decrease of 25 students, or $0.2 \%$, since August 2003.

A total of 5,619 students attended 8 government secondary colleges. This represents a decrease of 255 students, or $4.3 \%$, since August 2003.

A total of 330 students attended 4 government special schools. This represents an increase of 3 students, or $0.9 \%$, since August 2003.

Special schools cater for students with intellectual and physical disabilities, or who are emotionally and/or behaviourally disturbed.
6. Introductory English Centres (IEC)

IECs are for students who require intensive full time English language instruction.

## In August 2004

Total primary school enrolments were 19,705. This includes 1,318 primary school students enrolled at combined primary/high schools. (In August 2003, the figures were 20,212 (including Jervis Bay) and 1,425 respectively.) Total high school enrolments were 10,301. This includes 1,724 high school students enrolled at combined primary/high schools. (In August 2003, the figures were 10,326 and 1,708 respectively.) The three combined schools are Telopea Park School, Gold Creek School and the Wanniassa School. Note: The ACT Department of Education and Training administers Jervis Bay Primary School for the Commonwealth under a service agreement.
