# **Government School Bulletin**

February 2002 Census

#### Overview

On 20 February 2002 the ACT Government Schools Census was conducted. The Census indicated that a total of 37,608 students attended 95<sup>1</sup> schools. This represents a decrease of 584 students, or 1.53%, since February 2001.

A total of 20,759 students attended 69<sup>1</sup> ACT government primary schools. This represents a decrease of 435 students, or 2.1%, since February 2001.

A total of 10,288 students attended 17<sup>1</sup> government high schools. This represents a decrease of 39 students, or 0.4%, since February 2001.

A total of 6,276 students attended 8 government secondary colleges. This represents a decrease of 111 students, or 1.7%, since February 2001.

A total of 285 students attended 4 government special schools. This represents an increase of 1 student, or 0.4%, since February 2001.

Special schools cater for students with intellectual and physical disabilities, or who are emotionally and/or behaviourally disturbed.


#### 6. Introductory English Centres (IEC)

#### In February 2002

Total primary school enrolments were 20,759. This includes 1,424 primary school students enrolled at combined primary/high schools. (In February 2001, the figures were 21,194 (including Jervis Bay) and 1,400 respectively.)

Total high school enrolments were 10,288. This includes 1,662 high school students enrolled at combined primary/high schools. (In February 2001, the figures were 10,327 and 1,648 respectively.)

The three combined schools are Telopea Park School, Gold Creek School and the Wanniassa School.

Note: The ACT Department of Education and Community Services administers Jervis Bay Primary School for the Commonwealth under a service agreement.
