# **Government School Bulletin**

**February 2004 Census** 

#### Overview

On 18 February 2004 the ACT Government Schools Census was conducted. The Census indicated that a total of 36,333 students attended 96<sup>1</sup> schools. This represents a decrease of 859 students, or 2.3%, since February 2003.

A total of 19,668 students attended 70<sup>1</sup> government primary schools. This represents a decrease of 598 students, or 3.0%, since February 2003.

A total of 10,317 students attended 17<sup>1</sup> government high schools. This represents a decrease of 32 students, or 0.3%, since February 2003.

A total of 6,035 students attended 8 government secondary colleges. This represents a decrease of 226 students, or 3.6%, since February 2003.

A total of 313 students attended 4 government special schools. This represents a decrease of 3 students, or 0.9%, since February 2003.

The census includes students enrolled in a government school on census day.

### 5. Special Schools

Special schools cater for students with intellectual and physical disabilities, or who are emotionally and/or behaviourally disturbed.

#### 6. Introductory English Centres (IEC)


IECs are for students who require intensive full time English language instruction.

#### In February 2004

Total primary school enrolments were 19,668. This includes 1,336 primary school students enrolled at combined primary/high schools. (In February 2003, the figures were 20,266 (including Jervis Bay) and 1,433 respectively.) Total high school enrolments were 10,317. This includes 1,750 high school students enrolled at combined primary/high schools. (In February 2003, the figures were 10,349 and 1,710 respectively.)

The three combined schools are Telopea Park School, Gold Creek School and the Wanniassa School.

Note: The ACT Department of Education, Youth and Family Services administers Jervis Bay Primary School for the Commonwealth under a service agreement.
