




Welcome

WHY CHOOSE CANBERRA

Our Schools

- Canberra has excellent academic resources and a positive global reputation for education delivery and pathways.
- A continuous assessment plan for Year 11 and Year 12 means no final exam to enter universities.
- Each school with enrolled international students has an international Private Student (IPS) Coordinator who provides academic and welfare support to our students.

Our Programs

- Smaller groups of international students per school allow for accelerated English language fluency.
- Skill-based education tailored to each student's academic interests and capabilities.
- At college level, the only compulsory subject for international students is English as an Additional Language/Dialect (EALD).
- International students select from a wide range of subjects to make up their academic package, including flight, robotics, fashion design, maths, science, history, sports development, business, economics, visual and performing arts.

Our Support

- 24/7 student support services are provided by the ACT Government Education Directorate International Education Unit and a Student Assistance Line.
- Multilingual staff at the IEU office provide services in Chinese, Cantonese,
 Spanish, and Malay to international students and their families.
- International students receive individualised and targeted support in Canberra as they are a small cohort.
- · Parents' feedback meetings are held annually on a one-to-one basis.

WHAT MAKES CANBERRA DIFFERENT?

1. CONTINUOUS ASSESSMENT – UNIQUE EDUCATION SYSTEM



In most states, ATAR scores are calculated by combining students' day to day assessments and the results from the state wide final examination. However, in Canberra, our students' ATAR score is obtained 100% from students' Year 11 and Year 12 results. (Continuous Assessment).



2. SKILL FOCUSED EDUCATION

Skills development is an integrated part of the standard academic curriculum.

Canberra Government Schools support students to develop skills in:

3. ONE STOP SHOP





Primary School (Kindergarten-Year 6)

- · Maximum visa period in a primary school sector is three years.
- Children must be at least six years of age at the time of application to be eligible for a student visa.
- All primary aged international students must live in Canberra with a Department of Home Affairs approved relative. *Under Migration Regulation 1.03 a relative means a spouse, parent, brother or sister, grandparent, aunt, uncle, niece or nephew, step-uncle/aunt/niece/nephew.
- · School allocation is determined by students' local residential address.

High School (Year 7-Year 10)

- High schools in Canberra cater for students between the ages of 12 and 16 who study from Year 7 to Year 10.
- All secondary school students are enrolled in mainstream schools where they attend classes with local students and are further supported through tutorials for English language and study skills.
- Students under 16 years old must live in Canberra with a Department of Home Affairs approved relative.*

College (Year 11-Year 12)

- 100% continuous assessment with no final exam at the end of secondary schooling.
- No compulsory subjects except EALD and an extensive list of subjects from which to select.
- Students can choose subjects that they like, they are good at, and are related to their career aspirations.

ACADEMIC YEAR

Canberra Government Schools welcome new international students at the start of each 10-week term, and the full academic year is from late January to December. A two-week break separates each of the four terms.

- Semester 1 (Term 1 and Term 2): Late January/early February to July
- Semester 2 (Term 3 and Term 4): July to December
